Aramco Trading presents New Silk Road CEO of Year Award 2019 to ADNOC Group CEO



H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber, Minister of State & Group CEO of ADNOC,
received the 2019 New Silk Road CEO of the Year Honorary Award from
H.H. Sheikh Saleh bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Chairman of the Department of Economy and Industry, Chairman Port of Fujairah
and Mr. Ibrahim Al-Buainain, Aramco Trading CEO

H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber, Minister of State and Group CEO of ADNOC, was presented with the Aramco Trading New Silk Road CEO of the Year Honorary Award 2019 by Mr. Ibrahim Al-Buainain, CEO of Aramco Trading, at the 9th Gulf Intelligence Energy Markets Forum in Fujairah. The prestigious event was hosted by the Government of Fujairah and in the presence of H.H Sheikh Mohammed Bin Hamad Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah.

This distinguished annual award was inaugurated in 2017 to recognize the industry leaders who are pioneering the connectivity of the international energy industry across the New Silk Road, from Asia to the Middle East and Africa. Much of this economic integration is built on a foundation of physical energy supply, which stretches from the producing fields of the Arabian Peninsula to the massive consuming populations of Asia.

"The New Silk Road is reshaping the flow of global trade. By 2040, countries east of the UAE will account for more than two-thirds of global GDP, becoming the world's most significant driver of energy demand," said H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber. "ADNOC is leveraging the UAE's unique geographic location at the gateway to this region

and Fujairah is a critical enabler of this strategy," he added.

"Fujairah is a key partner for ADNOC's growing ambitions in global energy trading. As we make progress on our 2030 strategy, we are expanding exploration and optimizing our resources. We are well on track to expand our crude production capacity to 4 million barrels by 2020 and 5 million barrels by 2030. We are also unlocking vast reserves of natural gas to realize our goal of self-sufficiency and to eventually transition into a net exporter," H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber concluded.

The Honorary Award category was added to acknowledge the stand-out CEO who made the most significant impact across all four of the celebrated energy sectors of Trading, Refining, Storage and Ports over the previous year. ADNOC's pioneering activities in 2019 included the establishment of a joint-venture trading company with Eni and OMV, plus an agreement with South Korea's SKEC to build the world's largest single underground facility for oil storage.

"In the 16 months since H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber unveiled the ADNOC Downstream Strategy, scarcely a month has gone by without a major announcement on the latest piece in the company's downstream jigsaw puzzle that stretches from the Middle East to Asia," Mr. Al-Buainain said while introducing the 2019 Honorary Award nominee. "This determination to never put off until tomorrow what you can deliver today has been a signature characteristic of Dr. Sultan Al Jaber throughout his career," he said.

The main theme of the 2019 Forum focused on the new IMO 2020 regulation that comes into force on Jan. 1st, 2020, with the International Maritime Organization's (IMO) ruling of a 0.50% global sulfur cap for marine fuels, down from 3.5%. Compliance to the landmark decision by the IMO demands rapid adjustments across the global fuel supply chain and has already had farreaching consequences on shipping economics, global freight rates, refinery runs and trading arbitrage.

H.E. Dr. Sultan Al Jaber joined Mr. Ibrahim Al-Buainain, CEO, Aramco Trading; Mr. Mele Kyari, the CEO of the Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation; H.E. Admiral Mohab Mohamed Hussein Mamish, Presidential Adviser of the Suez Canal Economic Zone Projects and Egyptian Seaports; and Mr. Mike Muller, the Head of Trading in Asia for Vitol at the event in Fujairah. Forty other 40 speakers also addressed the gathering of 250 industry executives and government officials.

The Forum's title sponsor, the Port of Fujairah, was joined by other key partners: Aramco Trading, Vitol, S&P Global Platts, Mercuria, Uniper and National Bank of Fujairah. This year's media partners are Marasi News and Tank Terminals.

The New Silk Road CEO of the Year Awards, presented last night at a gala dinner ceremony in Fujairah, were hosted by Aramco Trading Company and produced by Gulf Intelligence Under the Patronage of H.H. Hamad bin Mohammad A -Sharqi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Fujairah.

H.E. Admiral Mohab Mohamed Hussein Mamish, recently retired Chairman of Egypt's Suez Canal Authority, led the class of 2019 by winning the Ports Award. This also included Mr. Arif Mahmood, CEO of Downstream, PETRONAS, who was recognized in the field of Oil Refining. Mr. Thomas Waymel, President of Trading & Shipping for TOTAL, received the 2019 Award for Energy Trading, and Mr. Roger Chia Kim Piow, Founder and Chairman of the Rotary Group of Companies, received the trophy for the Advancement of Oil Storage Capacity on the New Silk Road.

Abdullah Al Sharqi Inaugurates Asian Junior Boxing Championship



HH Sheikh Abdullah bin Hamad bin Saif Al Sharqi, President of the UAE Federation of Body Building and Physical Strength, inaugurated the Asian Boxing Championship for young men and women at Zayed Sports Complex in Fujairah with the participation of 230 players from 27 Asian countries under the patronage of HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad Al Sharqi.

The opening ceremony included a review of participating teams, AFC President Anas Al Otaiba, Chairman of the Organizing Committee Mohammed Bukhatir and a member of the Board of Directors of the UAE Boxing Federation, Abdullah Al Antali.

The championship was organized by the UAE and Asian Boxing Federations under the supervision of the General Sports Authority in cooperation with the Fujairah Martial Arts Club. The UAE team participated with eight boxers and two boxers.

The team participated in the tournament, which is held for the first time in the countries of West Asia to win the first places and win the medals after preparing the preparations through the external camp in Uzbekistan.



Sheikh Zayed's Space Vision a reality



In April 1962, Yuri Gagarin was the first human to journey into outer space. Seven years later, the United Arab Emirates was founded, and the Founding Father Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan did not waste any time as he was looking forward to achieving the space dream for the country.

In the 1970s, Sheikh Zayed held at least three meetings on space, including a memorable gathering in Abu Dhabi in February 1976 with three American astronauts.

About 43 years later, the UAE will send its first astronaut into space, making Sheikh Zayed's dream come true.

Sheikh Mohammed bin Rashid, Vice President and Ruler of Dubai, initiated the UAE Astronaut Programme in 2017 to find the first Emirati to represent the UAE in space.

Major Hazza Al Mansouri, a 34-year-old former military pilot, and Sultan Al Neyadi, a 38-year-old doctor of information technology and former engineer for the UAE Armed Forces, were declared the two most eligible Emiratis

In the 1970s, HH Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan, the Founding Father of the UAE, held at least three meetings on space.

In February 1976, he met with three American astronauts of Apollo17, Eugene A. Cernan, Ronald E. Evans, Harrison H. Schmitt and American-Egyptian NASA scientist, Farouk El-Baz and was presented with a model of the US Space Shuttle Columbia (which would be launched in 1981)

for the mission, with Al Mansouri taking the lead in the mission and Al Neyadi serving as his backup.

Both Al Mansouri and Al Neyadi were selected from 4,022 men and women between the ages of 17 to 67 who applied to represent the UAE in its first journey to space.

On September 25th, Al Mansouri boarded a Soyuz-MS 15 spacecraft at the Baikonur Cosmodrome in Kazakhstan and blasted off into space.

He spent eight days at the International Space Station, and carried out scientific experiments, etching his name in to UAE history.





Preparation began with Russian lessons at the Yuri Gagarin Cosmonaut Training Centre in Star City, Moscow, which is essential for communication with ground control and crew members.

Al Mansouri spoke at a press conference on September 5th, expressing pride to be the first UAE man to journey into space.

"I would like to thank everyone at the Yuri Gagarin Cosmonaut Training Centre for their support, their hospitality, and their expertise," said Al Mansouri, speaking in Russian.

"I also want to thank all the people of Russia for welcoming us into your beautiful country and giving us this wonderful experience."

Al Mansouri, 35, was placed in quarantine with the rest of the main and back-up crews for two weeks to ensure they were free of germs or infections ahead of the mission.

He returned to Earth safely on October 3rd and was carried to a medical centre wrapped in the UAE flag where he and the rest of the crew underwent immediate and preliminary health checks. They then transferred away from the landing site.

The crew returned by helicopter to the recovery staging area in Karaganda, Kazakhstan. Hague boarded a NASA plane for the return to Houston, and Ovchinin and Almansoori returned to their training base in Star City, Russia.

Though Al Mansouri will be the first Emirati to travel to space, he will not be the last, as Al Neyadi has been promised the next spot on a UAE mission to space.

There are plans to launch an exploration probe to Mars to mark the nation's 50th anniversary in 2020. The UAE Space Agency also intends to establish the first human colony on Mars by 2117.





Al Hayl Fortress



Al Hayl Fortress is strategically situated on a prominent rise overlooking the surrounding village and wadi.




According to local sources, the fortified courtyard house, mosque, majlis and watchtower were constructed around 1932. Bin Shimal, a local family living in Kalba and Fujairah, constructed houses in the area, including much of the house at al-Hayl A second builder by the name of bin Shambi also worked on the main house and the watchtower on the hill.

Prior to the construction of Sheikh Abdullah's house at al-Hayl, he resided in the large fortified courtyard house of his father, Sheikh Hamdan bin Suroor al-Sharqi, situated below Fujairah fort.

The gabbro/dolerite rocks used in the construction of the courtyard house, mosque, majlis and watchtower at al-Hayl were all locally sourced. Saruj was used on buildings at the site as mortar and plaster. Saruj plaster on the external walls was placed in layers, each layer ending with a small upward curvature. This was done so that any rain falling on the building would be diverted away from the foundations. A soft mudbased mortar was also used to bind the rocks

throughout parts of the construction. This soft mud mortar is also found on various walls, as a layer of plaster below the saruj or the gypsum. A fine and smooth gypsum plaster was used on many of the interior walls in the courtyard house. Mangrove (Avicennia marina) poles used in the construction were either traded from East Africa (Unwin 1988: 155), and/or locally sourced from the Khor Kalba area. Unidentified planks of hardwood were also used throughout the buildings. Date palm trunks, branches, stems and leaves were used extensively throughout all of the buildings in Wadi al-Hayl. Date palm tree fibre was also used to create ropes, which were used in the building construction.

Lastly, cement was also added to the construction of certain buildings at the site. The khaymah type rooms located within the courtyard house were semi-subterranean in nature. The walls were built with mountain rocks bound with a soft mud mortar and rubble fill. They contained pitched roofs constructed with wooden poles, which were covered with date palm branches.

The Watchtower

The watchtower located on the hill behind the courtyard house, to the south southwest, was originally built for Sheikh Abdullah's younger brother, Sheikh Suhail. Sheikh Suhail also resided in two khaymah type houses positioned directly below the watchtower.

The cleared and levelled area supported by a rockbuilt embankment located directly to the south of the watchtower was used to house camels during the night.

The fortified courtyard house and settlement in Wadi al-Hayl is reflective of a traditional mountain village in this region.

Fujairah teacher named as best in the Gulf region



Laila Obaid Salem Mutawa Al Yamahi, an Arabic teacher at Murbeh Secondary School in Fujairah, received the Mohamed bin Zayed Award for Best GCC Teacher at the Qudwa forum held in October.

Al Yamahi received the award due to her achievements including the development and implementation of 20 integrated plans, and the completion of more than 45 detailed plans over the past five years coinciding with the initiatives of the state such as Year of Zayed, Year of Good, Year of Innovation and Year of Tolerance. Each plan was based on introducing Diverse programs in line with competence and effectiveness and clear performance indicators including the preparation of a resource room for talents, and a book club of masterpieces of literature, named "Book Cafe". Laila also developed a comprehensive plan to embrace talent in terms of preparing and executing programs and events at the school.

The teacher has received more than 15 awards at the level of the country and region, including

the "role model" and "Innovation Award" in the top twenty, and the award of "educational research", and had an impact on the achievement of a student she supervised to achieve third place at the national level and the first in the UAE in the Arab Reading Challenge. She also received more than a thousand commendations from the school, the region, the Ministry and the local community, most notably a certificate of thanks from Sheikha Fatima bint Mubarak, a shield from the Qudwa Forum, a certificate of thanks from the Education Council, as well as numerous compliments from parents and students.

Addressing teachers from across all seven emirates, Sheikh Nahayan Bin Mabarak Al Nahayan, Minister of Tolerance said that, "The UAE recognizes that spreading the culture of tolerance and human brotherhood in the country and the world is not achieved automatically, but must be nurtured through continued work. The role of education in developing tolerant societal behaviour and respect for others, will ultimately prevent younger people from being attracted to temptations of violence, extremism or anti-social behaviour."

New UAE tax on e-cigarettes, sugary drinks, starts December 1st

UAE's Federal Tax **Authority** called on producers and importers to register for the excise system at the tax earliest to avoid late fines registration as the excise tax on e-cigarettes and sugary drinks starts on December 1st.

The UAE initially introduced 50-100 percent excise tax

on harmful goods such as soft and energy drinks and tobacco in October 2017 in a bid to improve public health.

The excise tax on electronic smoking devices and sweetened beverages will be effective as of December 1, 2019, according to the Federal Tax Authority (FTA).

The authority called on producers and importers of the products to register for the excise tax system at the earliest to avoid late registration fines.

The UAE initially introduced 50-100 percent excise tax on harmful goods such as soft and energy



drinks and tobacco in October 2017 in a bid to improve public health and cover the costs of public services through the newfound government revenue.

At the time, over 1,700 items were subjected to the excise tax, with 60 percent being soft drinks, 26 per cent being tobacco products and 14 per cent being energy drinks.

The tax will extend to, according to soft drink products that include either added sugar or other sweeteners, and that includes "beverage, liquid, concentrate, powders, extracts or any product that may be converted into a drink".

"The decision comes to support the UAE government's efforts to enhance public health and prevent chronic diseases directly linked to sugar and tobacco consumption," said the Cabinet General Secretariat in a statement.

"The decision aims at reducing the consumption of harmful products that put the health of people and environment at risk."

A series of cultural and literary events has marked the launch of the fourth phase of the Sharjah Beach Library initiative in Khorfakkan – part of the yearlong celebrations of Sharjah's UNESCO World Book Capital 2019 title.

Organised by the Sharjah World Book Capital Office (SWBC Office) in cooperation with Knowledge without Borders (KwB), the launch of the fourth phase sought to lure beachgoers of the pristine beaches of Khorfakkan into the fascinating world of the written word.



Stormy weather causes major damage in Fujairah



Large parts of a traditional market in Fujairah were destroyed during a particularly fierce storm as heavy rain and strong winds devastated the area in early October.

Many parts of the emirate, particularly the valleys and mountainous areas, were affected by the floods...

"Thunderstorms and strong winds lashed many areas, including Dibba Al Hisn, Dibba Al Fujairah, Kalba, and Khorfakkan," he said.

The National Center of Meteorology recorded 53.4mm of rainfall at Fujairah Port, 42.6mm at Khorfakkan, 36mm at Masafi, 32.6mm at Dibba Al Fujairah town, and 31.8mm in the Diddana area.

Parking canopies, external doors, road barriers and signboards have been destroyed by the heavy showers and high winds, according to Major General Mohammed Ahmed bin Ghanem, Commander-in-Chief of Fujairah Police.

Trees were uprooted some farm animals in the mountain areas were killed. No human casualties have been reported.

Some outlets at the traditional markets of the emirate were heavily impacted by the destructive weather conditions.

Fujairah Municipality deployed their, tankers and pumping machines to drain out accumulated water in the emirate.

The municipality workers removed many fallen trees, signboards, barriers, and debris from several public roads."

The Fujairah Municipality has also stated it will rebuild and develop the traditional market to be stronger, as well as wind and rain resistant.

The planned face-lift will preserve the traditional image of the market which is the oldest in the emirate."



Toastmasters- My Distinguished Toastmaster Journey

The Need: Being a lawyer by profession and having considerable courtroom experience, many of my friends thought that, I was a great public speaker by default. This is virtuously based on the Toastmasters International's Core Values of Integrity, Respect, Service and Excellence.

The Phobias: Truthfully speaking, I was a person, like many others, scared of public speaking and afraid of possible failures. How would I overcome these? -was the million dollar question. The answer came from Bill Cosby- "In order to succeed, your desire for success should be greater than your fear of failure."-and I took this in right earnest. While meeting the toastmasters, I noticed that many of them were professionals in their own field and this heightened my assurance to become part of this great organisation which I found to be a platform to make new friends as well as to interact with like minded people. I became bold and furious! Performance of various leadership roles and the process of preparing, practicing and delivering many speeches during regular meetings, commencing from the "Icebreaker",

boosted my confidence and determination levels which helped me to overcome the phobias and progress towards attaining short term and long term goals. I experienced the genuineness of the statement by Johann Wolfgang von Goethe - "Whatever you can do, or dream you can, begin it. Boldness has genius, power and magic in it."

I wish to express my gratitude to Toastmasters International, Fujairah Toastmasters Club (my home club), my mentors (to name a few) DTM Sujith Varghese, DTM Suryanarayanan Krishnamoorthy, DTM Anil Vidyadharan, TM Bose Thomas, TM Ajayraj and TM Pradeep Kumar for their timely inspiration. I am definitely indebted to every member of the propitious clubs wherein I performed-Fujairah Toastmasters (FTC), Scholars Toastmasters, Synergy Malayalam Toastmasters, Royals Toastmasters and every other Club- and where from I derived tons of learning from their wholehearted support and encouragement coupled with the selflessness! I hereby convey my sincere thankfulness to each one of the exuberant and self-sacrificing Toastmasters who made it possible for me to reach greater heights!



Countdown begins to World's Greatest Show - Expo 2020 Dubai



Expo 2020 Dubai is the first Expo event held in the Middle East, Africa, or South Asia. It is mega event and the site forms a part of Dubai South, an under-construction mixed use development double the size of Hong Kong Island.

Expo 2020 Dubai will have a dedicated Metro- the Red Line, which is being extended by more than nine miles. The US\$3 billion project, known as Route 2020, will create five new over ground and two underground stations running from Nakheel Harbour and Tower station to the site. Other areas to be covered are Discovery Gardens, Jumeirah Golf Estates and Dubai Investments Park. The new stretch of the driverless line is expected to begin operations in May 2020, and will be capable of transporting 46,000 passengers per hour in both directions.

There will be a 'Superstore of the Future' on site which will be 3,000 sqm in size, an unmissable

experience, featuring some of the latest retail technologies and trends, giving a glimpse into how people might shop in the future.

Al Wasl Plaza (meaning connection in Arabic), is the centrepiece of Expo 2020 Dubai and will host major celebrations. The dome will double up as a 360-degree projection screen, showing footage which you can watch from both inside and outside. During events, the basement areas beneath the site will be home to an underground road and rail network supporting day-to-day logistics.

Directly opposite Al Wasl Plaza will be the UAE Pavilion which will showcase the nation's heritage and achievements. The falcon-inspired pavilion will be a must for any visitor looking to light up their social media – with the structure's 'wings' moving up and down to harvest clean energy. Inside, you can explore the past, present and future of the UAE and its people.

Another noteworthy feature of Dubai South is the Sustainability Pavilion, which will explore ways to harvest energy from sunlight and fresh water from humid air, using photosynthesis as an inspiration.

Adjacent to the site will be the Expo Village, a residential community for delegates and other visiting officials. The project will consist of five, 16-storey towers containing almost 2,300 apartment units.

25 million visitors are expected to visit Expo 2020 Dubai, Australia's population is a similar number. More visitors than the populations of Greece and Bulgaria combined!

Expo has created almost 300,000 jobs. The majority in the tourism sector.

Sustainability is a subtheme for Expo 2020, therefore, half of the electricity used during the event

will be generated by wholly renewable sources.

Continuing with the theme of sustainability, 90 percent of the material used in permanent construction on the site will be reused or repurposed in the legacy buildings and infrastructure after the event. For example Al Wasl Plaza will continue to serve as a world-class event space, while the Sustainability Pavilion will become the Children and Science Centre, offering youngsters an enthralling and educational experience. Whilst the mixed-use development will comprise 65,000 square metres of residential space, 135,000 square metres of commercial space and 44,900 square metres of green parkland.

Uber has signed an agreement with Dubai's Roads and Transport Authority to test flying cars during the event.

The Expo 2020 logo was inspired by an ancient golden ring discovered in the UAE at 4,000-year-old archaeological site called *Saroug AI Hadeed*.



Expo 2020 Dubai will run for six months from October 20th 2020 to April 10th 2021, with pavilions open and entertainment scheduled between 10 am and 1 am on weekdays, and 10 am to 2 am on weekends. Tickets will be on sale in April 2020, starting from Dhs120.

Billed as "The World's Greatest Show", it's all happening in the Dubai South district, near Al Maktoum International Airport.

With an influx of international visitors expected, Dubai International Airport is also working to upgrade its runways, while new hotels are springing up near the Expo 2020 site.

Since Expo 2020 was revealed in November 2013, it's had a huge impact on the city and that's is growing as we get closer to the date. Officials say that the real estate market will rocket. That's not to mention the huge urban District 2020 that will have a long-lasting legacy for centuries after the event is over. Even the city's infrastructure is taking part, with Jebel Ali Lehbab Road renamed as Expo Road in honour of the event.

From the 25 million visitors that are expect 70 percent of these are expected to travel from outside the UAE, which will be the largest proportion of international visitors in the 168-year history of World Expos.

Expo 2020 Dubai is expected to serve 50 million meals, some of which will include fresh produce from the 130,000 sg ft vertical farm, the world's largest, which is located next door to the Expo site in Dubai South, will be providing fresh produce to various Emirates-operated outlets at the hugely-anticipated event.

But although Expo 2020 Dubai will welcome hundreds of thousands of visitors per day on average, its smart site will use artificial intelligence, cutting-edge crowd-flow management systems, smart ticketing and more to ensure everything runs seamlessly.

An expo is a world fair, bringing together hundreds of countries from across the globe – giving them the chance to share ideas

and innovations with the rest of the world.

The first was held in The Crystal Palace in London's Hyde Park in 1851, and since then, many of history's most famous inventions have been exhibited, including the telephone in 1876, the ice cream cone in 1904 and even a humanoid robot in Nagoya

When Dubai won the right to host Expo 2020. Fireworks exploded from the Burj Khalifa

and the Burj Al Arab. A national holiday was declared for all educational institutions across the country. His Highness Sheikh Mohammed Bin Rashid Al Maktoum Vice President and Prime Minister of the UAE and Ruler of Dubai, promised the city would "astonish the world", come 2020.



Cyber Bullying - A threat to online safety



Recent newspaper reports about cyber bullying cases raised our eyebrows and created panic among parents, students and society as a whole. Among them the most disturbing and threatening was from Bangalore, a South Indian city. An Indian Express news report, I read recently reveals the dangers of cyber bullying. A grade XI student, from a reputed school in the city was the victim. She is a brilliant student and a topper in the school. Prior to the

approach of her exams, her parents noticed a sudden change in her behaviour, as she became very quiet and subdued, lost her appetite, and appeared tensed and worried most of the times.

After a lot of probing, she confessed to being a victim to cyber bullying, as someone had impersonated her and created a fake account on a social networking site, and was posting derogatory and insulting information. Such an emotional abuse made her vulnerable to experiencing depressive symptoms, and her teachers advised her to seek professional help from mental health experts.

However, the surprising thing is that, such repeating cases would not deter teenagers from the careless usage of internet and social media. My experiences as a teacher and personal interaction with students brought an understanding that majority of youngsters are unaware of the dangers of reckless surfing of internet.

"Cyber bullying" is when someone, is tormented, threatened, harassed, humiliated, embarrassed or otherwise targeted by another using the Internet, social media and mobile phones. As the children and adolescents' access to technology is increasing in nowadays, cyber-bullying is becoming a growing concern."

Recent studies show that Most of the time cyber bullying goes unreported. The younger generation hides their traumatic experience from anyone that can help to prevent the bullying from occurring and from getting worse. Between 20% and 40% of adolescents are victims of cyber bullying worldwide. The need of the hour is to raise awareness among parents, teachers, students and authorities as a whole.

The role of teachers, parents, teens and Government to prevent Cyber bullying.

- Parents should monitor the social media and other online interactions of their kids and insist not to share any personal information such as telephone number, location and e-mail ID. Don't allow under aged kids to open social media accounts.
- Keep the computer in a common area of the home. Do not allow it in your children's bedrooms.
- The digital illiteracy of parents is a matter of concern. Parents should try to learn how various social networking websites work. Become familiar with Facebook, WhatsApp, and Twitter. Parents must see their kid's profile page.
- Encourage children to read newspapers and watch TV news. It helps them to be aware

- of cyber bullying cases and its dangers. Talk regularly and specifically with your children about online issues.
- Spent time with children to listen their concerns. Build trust with children. Discuss rules for online safety and Internet use.
- 6. Tell your children not to respond to any oyber bullying threats or comments online. However, do not delete any of the messages. Instead, print out all the messages, including the e-mail addresses or online screen names of the cyber bully. You will need the messages to verify and prove there is cyber bullying.
- School authorities should conduct awareness classes by experts for teachers, parents and students
- Don't threaten to take away your children's gadgets, if they come to you with a problem.
 This only forces kids to be more secretive.
- Talk to your school's guidance counsellors so they can keep an eye out for bullying during the school day.
- If there are threats of bullying continues, the matter should be reported to the police.



Remember excerpts from the famous quote,





What to know about breast cancer



Breast cancer is the most common invasive cancer in women and the second leading cause of cancer death in women after lung cancer.

Advances in screening and treatment for breast cancer have improved survival rates dramatically since 1989. The chance of any woman dying from breast cancer is around 1 in 38 (2.6%).

However, due to advances in treatment, death rates from breast cancer have been decreasing since 1989.

Awareness of the symptoms and the need for screening are important ways of reducing the risk.

Symptoms

The first symptoms of breast cancer usually appear as an area of thickened tissue in the breast or a lump in the breast or an armpit.


Other symptoms include:

- pain in the armpits or breast that does not change with the monthly cycle
- pitting or redness of the skin of the breast, similar to the surface of an orange
- a rash around or on one of the nipples
- discharge from a nipple, possibly containing blood
- a sunken or inverted nipple
 - a change in the size or shape of the breast
- peeling, flaking, or scaling of the skin on the breast or nipple

Most breast lumps are not cancerous. However, women should visit a doctor for an examination if they notice a lump on the breast.

Stages

A doctor stages cancer according to the size of the tumour and whether it has spread to lymph nodes or other parts of the body.

Risk factors

The exact cause of breast cancer remains unclear, but some risk factors make it more likely. It is possible to prevent some of these risk factors.

- Age-The risk of breast cancer increases with age. At 20 years, the chance of developing breast cancer in the next decade is 0.06%. By the age of 70 years, this figure goes up to 3.84%.
- 2. Genetics- If a close relative has or has had breast cancer, a person's chance of developing breast cancer increases. Women who carry the BRCA1 and BRCA2 genes have a higher chance of developing breast cancer, ovarian cancer, or both. People can inherit these genes from their parents. TP53 is another gene with links to increased breast cancer risk.
- 3. A history of breast cancer or breast lumps-Women who have previously had breast cancer are more likely to have it again than those who have no history of the disease. Having some types of noncancerous breast lump increases the chance of developing cancer later on. Examples include atypical ductal hyperplasia or lobular carcinoma in situ.
- Dense breast tissue- Women with more dense breasts are more likely to receive a diagnosis of breast cancer.
- 5. Estrogen exposure and breast-feeding Extended exposure to Estrogen appears to increase the risk of breast cancer. This could be due to a person starting their periods earlier or entering menopause at a later than average age. Between these times, Estrogen levels are higher. Breast-feeding, especially for over 1 year, appears to reduce the chance of developing breast cancer. This is possibly due to the drop in Estrogen exposure that follows pregnancy and breast-feeding.
- 6. Body weight- Women who become overweight or develop obesity after menopause may also have a higher chance of developing breast cancer, possibly due to increased Estrogen levels. High sugar intake may also be a factor.

- 7. Alcohol consumption- A higher rate of regular alcohol consumption appears to play a role in breast cancer development. According to the National Cancer Institute (NCI), studies have consistently found that women who consume alcohol have a higher risk of breast cancer than those who do not. Those who drink moderate to heavy levels of alcohol have a higher risk than light drinkers.
- Radiation exposure- Undergoing radiation treatment for a different cancer may increase the risk of developing breast cancer later in life.
- 9. Hormone treatments- According to the NCI, studies have shown that oral contraceptives may slightly increase the risk of breast cancer. According to the ACS, studies have found that hormone replacement therapy (HRT), specifically estrogen-progesterone therapy (EPT), is related to an increased risk of breast cancer.

Types

There are several different types of breast cancer, including:

- Ductal carcinoma: This begins in the milk duct and is the most common type.
- Lobular carcinoma: This starts in the lobules.





Invasive breast cancer occurs when the cancer cells break out from inside the lobules or ducts and invade nearby tissue. This increases the chance of cancer spreading to other parts of the body.

Noninvasive breast cancer develops when the cancer remains inside its place of origin and has not yet spread. However, these cells can sometimes progress to invasive breast cancer.

Diagnosis

A doctor often diagnoses breast cancer as the result of routine screening or when a woman approaches her doctor after detecting symptoms. Several diagnostic tests and procedures help to confirm a diagnosis.

Breast exam

The doctor will check the breasts for lumps and other symptoms.

During the examination, the person may need to sit or stand with their arms in different positions, such as above their head or by their sides.

Imaging tests

Several tests can help detect breast cancer. Mammogram: This is a type of X-ray that doctors commonly use during an initial breast cancer screening. It produces images that can help a doctor detect any lumps or abnormalities.

A doctor will usually follow any suspicious results with further testing. However, mammography sometimes shows a suspicious area that turns out not to be cancer.

Ultrasound: This scan uses sound waves to help a doctor differentiate between a solid mass and a fluid-filled cyst.

MRI: A doctor may recommend an MRI as a follow-up to a mammogram or ultrasound. Doctors sometimes use them as a screening tool for those at higher risk of breast cancer.

Biopsy

In a biopsy, the doctor extracts a sample of tissue and sends it for laboratory analysis.

This shows whether the cells are cancerous. If they are, a biopsy indicates which type of cancer has developed, including whether or not the cancer is hormone sensitive.

Diagnosis also involves staging the cancer to establish:

- the size of a tumour
- how far it has spread
- · whether it is invasive or noninvasive
- .

Staging provides a picture of a person's chances of recovery and their ideal course of treatment.

Treatment

Treatment will depend on several factors, including:

- the type and stage of the cancer
- · the person's sensitivity to hormones
- the age, overall health, and preferences of the individual
- The main treatment options include:
- radiation therapy
- surgery
- biological therapy, or targeted drug therapy
- hormone therapy
- chemotherapy

Factors affecting the type of treatment a person has will include the stage of the cancer, other medical conditions, and their individual preference.

Outlook

A person's outlook with breast cancer depends on the staging. Early detection and treatment usually lead to a positive outlook.

According to the ACS, a person who receives treatment for stage 0 or stage 1 breast cancer has a 99% chance of surviving for at least 5 years after being diagnosed, when compared to women who do not have cancer.

If breast cancer reaches stage 4, the chance of surviving another 5 years reduces to around 27%. Regular checks and screening can help detect symptoms early. Women should discuss their options with a doctor.

Regular screening

The American College of Physicians (ACP) recommend that women aged 40–49 years with an average risk of breast cancer should discuss the benefits and risks of regular screenings with a doctor.

Between 50 and 74 years of age, women who have an average risk should undertake screenings every 2 years. Beyond 75 years of age, doctors only recommend screenings for women with a life expectancy of 10 or more years.

The ACS suggest that women of average risk can choose to have yearly scans from the age of 40 years onward. Those who have not should start annual screening at 45 years of age. They may decide to switch to screenings every other year when they reach 55 years of age.

The American College of Radiologists recommend screenings every year, starting from 40 years of age.

Prevention

There is no way to prevent breast cancer. However, certain lifestyle decisions can significantly reduce the risk of breast cancer.

These include:

- avoiding excessive alcohol consumption
- following a healthful diet containing plenty of fresh fruit and vegetables
- getting enough exercise
- maintaining a healthy body mass index (BMI)



Guinness World Records said it has no official record for not blinking, but website RecordSetter. com lists the world record as being 1 hour, 5 minutes and 11 seconds, set by Julio Jaime of Colorado in 2016.



New England Giant Pumpkin Weigh-off won by 2,295-pound gourd

The New England Giant Pumpkin Weigh-Off announced this year's winner tipped the scales at 2,294.5 pounds- a new record for the competition.

The pumpkin, grown by Connecticut man Alex Noel, dwarfed the competition at the annual weigh-off, which is part of the Topsfield Fair.

The 2,294.5-pound pumpkin is heavier even than a Mitsubishi Eclipse, which is only 2,018 pounds.

The pumpkin was a new record for the contest, but fell short of the world record, a 2,624.6-pound pumpkin grown by Belgian man Mathias Willemijns in 2016.



Guinea Pig Ice Cream Becoming A Cool New Treat In Ecuador

Anyone who thinks of guinea pigs as pets _ cute, squishy, squeaking bundles of fur _ might find that idea hard to digest.

The rodents are a traditional hot dish in some Latin American countries, including Colombia, Peru and Bolivia. In Ecuador, people typically cook guinea pigs with salt and serve them with potatoes and peanut sauce. But one vendor is taking things to another gastronomic level, serving guinea pigs as a cold dessert. Some people like ice cream made from "cuy," as the animal is locally known.

The stall owner is María del Carmen Pilapaña, whose offbeat offering inspires disbelief and laughter among first-time customers. She also makes 40 servings of ice cream flavored with beetles, also traditionally eaten as a salty snack, and a smaller amount of mushroom ice cream.

The beetle and mushroom ice creams include fruits such as pineapple and passion fruit. Beetle ice cream has a slight aroma of wet earth.





Drug traffickers rescue police officers at sea off Spanish coast

Three Spanish maritime patrol agents were rescued by drug traffickers they were chasing at sea off the coast of Spain, local authorities said. As the agents attempted to intercept the boat with suspected narcotics off the Costa del Sol. The agents' boat went "out of control" and hit the side of the suspects' vessel and the officers fell into the sea, Civil guard authorities said.

The suspects rescued the three police officers as a helicopter hovered over the area realising the imminent danger to the civil guards, required the occupants of the other vessel to support them by public address.

Although the four men rescued the occupants, they were arrested for drug trafficking after 80 bundles of hashish -- weighing more than three tons -- were found in the sea.



Colorado father and son make their own Lamborghini with 3D printer

A Colorado physicist is putting his scientific expertise to a practical purpose using a 3D printer to build a Lamborghini with his 11-year-old son.

Sterling Backus and his son started work on their full-size, working model of an Italian supercar -- specifically the Lamborghini Aventador -- when the boy asked his father if it was possible.

Sterling Backus said his background as a "gear head" has thus far been more helpful than his training as a physicist.

The car won't be a proper Lamborghini, it contains a Corvette V8 engine and various parts procured from a junkyard, including Porsche components, but Backus said it will look like the real thing.

The father and son recently posted video of the vehicle going for a short drive test.




Indian sisters-in-law run backward for 13 hours



Pacman fires 42 as Team MPBL get even with Dubai All Stars

Philippine Senator Manny Pacquiao thrilled the sizeable Filipino crowd with his offensive prowess but it was the Dubai All Stars-DJMC who took first blood scoring a thrilling 99-96 overtime win Friday 30th September in the Maharlika Pilipinas Basketball League's Dubai Invasion 2019.

The 40-year-old Pacquiao, the only eight-division world champion in boxing history, showcased his scoring prowess, firing a game-high 35 points on an array of outside jumpers and daring drives much to the delight of his Kababayans who trooped their way to the sprawling Hamdan Sports Complex along the Emirates Road.

But the Dubai All Stars-DJMC, composed of former pro and collegiate Filipino cagers who are now based in UAE, had other plans as they played all out right from the opening tip to take the opener of the exhibition matches serving as fitting appetisers for regular MPBL matches.

Former MBA star Chris De Jesus led the hosts with 17 points while former University of the East standout Arnold Booker and Perpetual Help product Chris Elopre tallied 16 points apiece as they took turns in the extra five-minute period that salvaged what seemed to be a blown opportunity in regulation.

It was Pacquiao, as expected, who commanded much of the spotlight in the opening day of the league's breakthrough foray overseas made possible by the Dubai Sports Council and Hamdan Sports Complex, with Happy Holidays, Herschel, Blue Eyes, King's Medical Center, Shogun Global and Transform as support sponsors.

Pacquiao sustained his fiery form as Team Maharlika Pilipinas Basketball League Executives got back at Dubai All Stars-DJMC 107-101 on the Saturday night, at the close of the MPBL Dubai Invasion 2019 showpiece at Hamdan Sports Complex.

A night after scoring 35 points in a 99-96 setback, the 40-year-old Pacquiao showed no signs of slowing down, exploding for a gamebest 42 points, spiked by six triples, while leading his team to an impressive wire-to-wire victory in the weekend hoopfest supported by Dubai Sports Council and Hamdan Sports Complex management.

Former pro Emmer Oreta scattered 12 of his 14 points in their dominant first-half performance while David Sisson, Pacquiao's personal assistant, added 12 points, all from beyond the arc, as the visitors asserted their might in the second canto, led by as many as 26 points and did enough to hold off the hosts' repeated rallies.

"It's been a great weekend for us," said Pacquiao, the league founder who also issued a team-best six assists on top of two steals and as many rebounds. "I really enjoyed competing against my Kababayans here in the UAE. Thank you to everyone who came and supported us."

Dunstan Rozario, Chairman of DJMC Events, the main organiser of the weekend hoopfest, also sounded grateful of hosting for Pacquiao and Co. "It's an honour to have Senator Manny back here in Dubai. And we look forward to future collaborations with him. Expect a bigger and better show next year."

In the main match of MPBL's first international foray which has Happy Holidays, Herschel, Blue Eyes, King's Medical Center, Shogun Global and Transform as support sponsors, Jason Melano completed a go-ahead three-point play with 3.3 seconds left as Batangas City Athletics outlasted Imus Bandera, 86-85, in overtime.

Top gunner Val Acuna finished with 19 points while Melano registered a double-double of 18 points and 10 rebounds for the Athletics, who bounced back from a 67-57 setback dealt by the Davao Occidental Tigers last Friday and improved their record to 10-5 in the South Division.

Imus forward Jeric Nacpil had a game-high 20 points while Kapamilya actor Gerald Anderson

scored 10 points that all went for naught after former pro league MVP J-Jay Helterbrand missed potential game-winning treys in both regulation and extra period.

The Bandera, in the process, suffered their sixth straight setback and fell to 3-12 overall.

All eyes, as expected, still focused on Pacquiao, the only eight-division world champion in boxing's rich history who proved that he can also provide top entertainment through the sport closest to the Filipinos' hearts.

With the result already beyond doubt, Pacquiao did his best impersonation of former NBA superstar Tracy McGrady's trademark move twice, bouncing the ball off the board before laying it in that drew loud cheers from throngs of fans in attendance.

Lefty Jerry Mendez finished with a team-high 22 points while skipper Sonny Toring, Jacob Rosal and Enrico Bawic tallied at least 11 points each for the Dubai All Stars-DJMC team comprised of Filipino expats in the Middle East, who still received US\$1,000 as consolation prize from Pacquiao.

Schedules announced for Emirates Airline Dubai Rugby Sevens

The pools and schedules for the first combined men's and women's HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series event of the 2020 season have been announced.

Held on 5-7th December, 2019, the Emirates Airline Dubai Rugby Sevens marks the start of this season's men's competition as well as the race for Olympic glory

as rugby sevens prepares to make its second appearance on the Olympic Games programme at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games.

Dubai will be the second stop on the 2020 women's competition after the opening round took place in Glendale, Colorado on 5-6 October where hosts USA were victorious.

Hosted at the iconic Sevens Stadium, this year's tournament celebrates 50 years of the Dubai Sevens and will see all men's and women's matches played on the main pitch for the first time in its history.

As the only permanent stop on the women's series since its inaugural year in 2012, Dubai is now one of eight tournaments for the women's teams this season – a record number for the women's competition – and is one of six combined men's and women's events alongside Cape Town, Hamilton, Sydney, Hong Kong and Paris.

Day one of the three-day event will see each of the 24 teams play one pool game each, with Spain and Ireland leading the proceedings in the women's competition.

Reigning Dubai and World Series Champions, New Zealand will take on invitational side Japan



in a Pool C clash with last year's runners-up, Canada facing Russia in Pool A.

Brazil, also of Pool A and who earned core status onto the HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series this season, will play their opening game against USA who won their second ever gold medal in Glendale in October.

In the men's competition it will be Samoa and Canada in Pool C who get things underway on day one.

Similarly to their female counterparts, New Zealand will be looking to retain their title in Dubai as they take on Wales in another Pool C encounter.

Reigning World Series Champions, Fiji will play their first game of the season against Japan, who are welcomed as the men's invitational side.

After winning the qualifier event in Hong Kong this year, Ireland earned promotion to the HSBC World Rugby Sevens Series and will kick off their campaign as a core team against 2019 series runners-up, USA.

Both men's and women's USA teams recorded their highest ever finishes on the world series last season, with the men's side obtaining medals in



CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the U.A.E. official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

<u>Credit cards:</u> Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)




