

Maktoum Al Sharqi attends Red Bull International Cycling Event



HH Sheikh Maktoum bin Hamad Al Sharqi attended the closing ceremony of the Red Bull World Cycling Championship, organised by Fujairah Adventure Centre at Fujairah Adventure Park held under the patronage of HH Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah.

The tournament saw 240 men and women from different countries of the world compete in order to win first place and book their card to qualify for the World Cup final in Switzerland.

Sheikh Maktoum stressed the importance of the role played by the Emirate of Fujairah in hosting major sports competitions, thanks to the directives of HH Sheikh Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Fujairah and the follow-up of the Crown Prince Sheikh Mohammed. He expressed his happiness that the Emirate of Fujairah was the first Arab/Asian city to host this important sporting event, praising the efforts made by all those responsible for the success of the championship and the role of the Fujairah Adventure Centre and the sponsors of the competition.

Sheikh Maktoum was accompanied by HH Sheikh Faisal bin Humaid Al Qasimi, President of the Arab Cycling Federation, who honoured the winners of the championship and the supporters and partner institutions that contributed to the organization of the first edition of the Red Bull World Cycling Championship.

The closing ceremony was attended by HH Sheikh Saeed Sorour Saif Al Sharqi, Chairman of Fujairah Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Salem Al Zahmi, Director of the Office of His Highness the Crown Prince of Fujairah, a number of directors of government institutions in the emirate and a large number of cycling fans. Fighting off an injury, Kuwaiti BMX rider Mansour Al Safran smashed the Middle East's very first edition of Red Bull Pump Track, which took place this weekend in Fujairah.

Following its global launch last year, the Red Bull Pump Track World Championship finally came to the UAE last month.

The event was the first of its kind in the region where BMX and MTB riders competed on an equal platform.

And Al Safran completed the Velosolutions pump track in record time

Taking to Instagram, he posted: "Glad to get first place in Red Bull Pump Track World Championships in Fujairah, after [a] long day fighting with my injury in my first run."

He later said, "I am very excited to see the event in our region. If you would have told me at the beginning of my journey that the UAE will host an event like this, I would not have been able to imagine it!

Coming in second place in the men's heat was the UK's Oliver Ogdan, with the UAE's Abdulla Alhosani in third.

Meanwhile, the UK's Tara Atkinson took the women's heat, with the UAE's Aisha Almehairi coming in second place, and Juane Van Tander from the Netherlands in third.

Following her win, Atkinson posted: "I managed to set a time of 35 seconds in the first heat which carried me through to the finals. I then went onto competing with a consistent time and came out on top. It was a hot 40 degrees all day and the main battle we faced was not getting overheated and staying focused.

"The race was epic, men's had a ton of excitement and a lot of near misses and was an all-round great vibe. Maybe I should head over to Switzerland for the finals as I have a guaranteed entry?"



IFBB World Men's Championship hosted in Fujairah



H.H Sheikh Abdullah Bin Hamad Al Sharqi and Dr. Rafael Santonja, in Madrid (Spain) signing the agreement for World Bodybuilding Championships Fujairah 2019.

The IFBB World Championship and Congress will take place in Fujairah on 5th-10th November at an event held with all the Institutional support, celebrating a great year of progress in all its programs, under the guidance of HH Sheikh Abdullah bin Hamad bin Saif Al Sharqi, Chairman of the Emirates Bodybuilding Federation, Vice President of the IFBB for Asia.

The President of the International Union of Bodybuilding Dr. Rafael Santoga has praised the efforts of the United Arab Emirates in supporting the sport of bodybuilding at the local and international levels and the forthcoming hosting of the World Cup, brings together the two sides during the Eastern coronation of a number of winners of the European Championships in Barcelona In Spain, in response to an official invitation by the International and Spanish bodybuilding associations, in the presence of UAE national bodybuilding coach Zwaid Salmin Zaabi.

Sheikh Abdullah and his Organizing Committee for the World Championships launched its preparations early in the year in order to achieve the full readiness and in order to fit the status of the United Arab Emirates in all aspects, including in the organization of sports tournaments, and presented the oriental perceptions of the technical and administrative organizing committee about the forthcoming hosting and its assurances will appear distinctly.

The World Cup incorporates the categories of Bodybuilding, Games Bodybuilding, Classic Body Building, Men's Physique and the participation of national federations of 130/140 countries, due to the special conditions of easy visa and permit processes, as well as in the progressive increase of participation of African countries, which this year celebrate their first major Continental Championship and countries of Oceania, an area that has excellent communications with Dubai airport.

Fujairah is looking forward to the participation of about 1200 athletes, administrators, referees, union leaders and representatives during the UAE's hosting of the General Assembly of the International Bodybuilding Federation, in addition to the competition.

This will be the 73rd edition of the World Bodybuilding Championships,

Sheikh Abdullah and Dr. Rafael Santonja, signed the contract with the official agreement in presence of the Minister of Industry and several executive officials from UAE Bodybuilding Federation in Madrid, on 13th November 2018.

The Emirate of Fujairah is known as a key point for Bodybuilding in the Gulf Area, and has wide experience in the organization of International Bodybuilding contests, such as the IFBB Diamond Cup etc

There will be a number of pertinent events in the city of the sport during this week, hosting other

complementary activities that will support the healthy lifestyle and the passion for weightlifting.

UAE flag on Soyuz FG rocket



The Soyuz FG, carrying the Soyuz MS-15 spacecraft, in which Hazzaa Al Mansoori, the first Emirati astronaut, was launched to the International Space Station on 25th September and was emblazoned with the logo of the Mohammed bin Rashid Space Centre and the UAE flag along with the flags of Russia and America for the historic mission.

The Soyuz rocket was first launched in 1966, and the launch system was developed by Korolev Rocket and Space Corporation, Energia, and built by the Research and Production Development Center of Progress Rocket Space Centre in Samara, Russia.

This photo of the Soyuz FG rocket was taken from the Baikonur Cosmodrome facilities in Kazakhstan, where the three stages of the rocket are being assembled ahead of the launch. In a press statement Mariam Ibrahim Al Mahmoud, Acting Deputy Director General, Director of Executive Training, Emirates Diplomatic Academy said,

"This is a moment of glorious pride for me and all the people of my homeland. It is a historic milestone for our nation. It consolidates the UAE's standing in the global space industry as a country with unlimited ambition - a country focused on leadership that seeks to enrich human knowledge, one that opens new horizons for the scientific community, and contributes to empowering humanity as it races towards a brighter future.

I am honoured to congratulate our wise leadership and the people of the UAE on this great achievement. We are proud of our astronauts, who are representing the UAE as they carry our ambitions with them on this mission. As they embed our homeland's clear and influential footprint in space, they also embody our commitment to further advancing and elevating the UAE's standing in various field".

Salik road toll gates for Abu Dhabi



This month Abu Dhabi implements its road toll system. October 15th will be the official start date for the new system and tolls will be effective from that day. Before October 15th, drivers will be required to have an account and it to be topped up with credit.

Residents are already scrambling to create payment accounts on the dedicated website.

The Integrated Transport Centre (ITC), the emirate's transport sector regulator, has not yet issued a statement urging motorists to register their vehicles.

Owners of Abu Dhabi-registered vehicles do not have to create payment accounts. When trying to sign up, owners of Abu Dhabi-registered vehicles see a message saying that a user account will be created for them automatically.

"Ahead of toll system activation, an SMS with account login detail will be sent to their mobile

number, as registered with Abu Dhabi Police," the message reads. It adds that these users only need to sign up vehicles registered outside Abu Dhabi after they receive their user sign-in details.

Vehicles registered outside Abu Dhabi have to sign up for the toll system.

How much will it cost?

A total of Dhs4 will be charged every time a vehicle passes through one of the gates in Abu Dhabi during peak times.

Peak times are between 7am and 9am then 5pm and 7pm Saturday to Thursday.

During off-peak hours and public holidays, the fee will be reduced Dhs2.

A maximum fee of Dhs16 will be charged each day, so drivers passing through four or more toll gates each day at peak times will not be charged more than the daily maximum.

Some government vehicles, emergency services and motorcycles are exempt from the charge.

Electric cars are being given a two-year grace period and must be registered from October 2021.

When is the fee reduced?

During off-peak hours, Fridays and public holidays the toll will be reduced to Dhs2.

Off peak hours are between 7pm and 7am then 9am to 5pm, Saturday to Thursday.

How is it charged?

Drivers are required to create an account before the launch on October 15th where they can add credit.

Vehicles will not be required to add a sticker to their window and they will instead be identified by the license plate number and credit will be taken automatically from the owner's account.

How do I set up an account?

Drivers are now able to register their vehicle and prepare for the October 15 launch date by visiting www.itps.itc.gov.ae.

All users registering must have a valid Emirates ID card, car registration, email address and phone number to create their account.

Additionally, for drivers with vehicles registered outside Abu Dhabi, a minimum of Dhs100 must be added to an account when being registered for the new system.

An amount of this deposit, said to be Dhs50, will be paid back into the users account to be used to pay tolls.

Are there fines?

Fines will be in place for a number of different offences effective from October 15th.

Passing through a toll gate with an unregistered vehicle, after a ten-day grace period, will result in a Dhs100 fine for the first day, Dhs200 for the second day, Dhs400 for the third day, up to the maximum fine of Dhs10,000.

Passing through a toll gate with insufficient balance, after the ten day grace period will result in a fine of Dhs50.

Drivers who tamper with their license plate in order to evade the toll will also be fined Dhs10,000.

Can you use a Dubai Salik account?

No, drivers will be required to have a separate account for the Abu Dhabi tolls. The two road toll systems are entirely independent of one another.

So drivers commuting between the capital and Dubai will have to ensure they have sufficient balance in their Abu Dhabi and Salik account or face fines.

Where are the tolls?

Four toll gates will be placed throughout Abu Dhabi and these are already in place but are not yet activated.

The tolls are located at the following bridges: Sheikh Zayed Bridge, Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Bridge, Al Maqtaa Bridge and Mussafah Bridge.

Drivers who are on the roads on Abu Dhabi island not passing through gates will not be charged.

In addition, those on Yas Island, Khalifa City A, Al Raha Beach and the surrounding areas, not travelling to Abu Dhabi island, will not have to pay tolls.

Why has this been introduced?

The Department of Transport - Abu Dhabi says it aims to reduce traffic congestion and raise the efficiency of public transport services with the introduction of the new system.

The move also aims to encourage drivers to consider carpooling and reducing the number of vehicles on the road in the city.

To help residents get around the city 327 new buses have been introduced to Abu Dhabi.



A Hidden Gem



The UAE is known for seeing and experiencing the biggest, the best, the most opulent, the most unique! Unusually not so many people know about Dubai's Pearl Museum and it's display of one of the world's largest collections located in Emirates NBD on Baniyas Road in Dubai.

Preservation of the UAE culture and heritage is at the heart of the Group and in addition to supporting various initiatives that aim to preserve the UAE culture, Emirates NBD launched the first pearl museum in the region in 2003. All the pearls exhibited there belonged to one private person, Sultan Al Owais (1925-2000). It was his father, Ali Bin Abdullah Al Owais, a pearl trader of the Shamsi tribe of Sharjah, who started to collect the pearls and also invested to establish a financial institution to serve local needs. He did not survive to see his dream come true but his son, Sultan, completed the mission when he became the first chairman of National Bank of Dubai in 1963 and he has continued to collect pearls.



Sultan Al Owais kept this priceless collection out of nostalgia for a way of life which has now vanished from the Gulf. His wish was that the pearls should be available to remind people of the origins of the Emirates and what life was like before the discovery of oil.

By the time of his demise in January 2000, Sultan Al Owais owned one of the largest pearl collections in the world and he gifted it to the people of the Gulf under the custodianship of the National Bank of Dubai. The Pearl Museum was inaugurated in 2003, on the National Bank of Dubai's 40th anniversary. The bank is known now as Emirates NBD.


Along with the magnificent collections of pearls as sole pieces or jewellry made of these materials, the museum portrays the lives of well know divers and sailors and the instruments they used during the discovery of pearls and other precious materials from the interiors of the oceans.



Visits at the museum are by appointment only and they will allow a maximum number of 21 visitors with a minimum 7 people.(If less; you can join another group of people depending on the tours availability). The tour guide joins every group for presenting the museum. Because it is not only about the pearls themselves, it is also about the history of the pearl divers and merchants of Arabia and also about the origin of UAE and how life was before the oil boom. The discovery of oil ended the "pearl age" in the Gulf.

The beauty of the pearls is given also by the water the oysters grow in. That's way, the warm, shallow water of the Gulf helped to produce ones of the most beautiful pearls in the world. And

they reached destinations all over the world, from Bombay to New York. One interesting thing is that in the Gulf men didn't use to wear pearls, like in the other parts of the world. This was a privilege only for women.

The history of the Gulf is closely linked to the pearls. The "Dive" was the only source of income for many men over the centuries. It was only one trip every year with for about four months and the share of the catch had to sustain their families for the rest of the year. Equipment and pictures from the trips are also displayed at the museum.

And even if the exhibits are just maybe 100 years old, the pearls and their origin became subject of



The Queen of Gems

Each of the factors that may contribute to perfection are rarely found together in one pearl.

Value is determined by the best combination of size, lustre, colour, surface quality and shape.

Size and weight

This will depend on the age or type of oyster in which the pearl was found. A large pearl will not necessarily be valuable if any of the other features is poor. Arabic names for size also hint at overall quality, with Dana being the most perfect, large and therefore valuable. Following this in descending order are *Hasabi*, *Ras*, *Betten*, *Thail*, *Rubiai'a* and *Satheet*. Until fairly recently pearls were weighed in grains, with four grains equalling one carat. Today pearls are sold by carat weight and their size is measured in millimetres.

Shape

The most sought after shape is symmetrical. Baroque pearls are irregular in shape but can be very valuable if the lustre and size is excellent. Teardrop and pear-shaped pearls are also highly prized.

Colour

Top quality pearls are colourful, like an oyster shell. The highest prices are often paid for pearls that are silvery white or have a light pink tint. In the Gulf, pearls with a golden hue are the most highly prized.

Lustre

The difference between a pearl with very high lustre (sharp, mirrorlike reflection) and very low lustre (milky or chalky appearance) is easy to detect. The majority of pearls fall into the low and medium lustre range.

Surface quality

The presence of flaws, in the surface of the pearl, are not necessarily important. However if the flaws are very prominent the value of the pearl will be reduced.

Walk on the wild side of Mleiha!



The Mleiha Archaeological Centre's Adventure Tour packages will show you a whole different face of the desert, with close encounters of little-known fauna and flora.

A trip to Mleiha is like stepping back in time. The past few decades of excavations have turned up more and more evidence, dating back as far as the Palaeolithic age, that establishes how important the region is archaeologically. Many of these discoveries can be experienced by visitors as part of the Archaeological Tours conducted by the Mleiha Archaeological Centre.

However, Mleiha is a lot more than just archaeology digs. It holds a vast field of exciting discovery for the nature lover as well. The region has a plethora of flora and fauna including some rare plants and animals that are not easily found elsewhere.

The topography of Mleiha is so diverse that you will find the landscape changing every few kilometres, with the rolling sand dunes suddenly merging into alluvial gravel plains and limestone outcrops suddenly popping up to enliven the scenery. Such diversity naturally allows rare plants and animals to inhabit and thrive in this terrain.

The reason why these diverse elements have survived and flourished in the area is due to the foresight of the Mleiha Archaeological and Eco-tourism Project. Established by the Sharjah Investment and Development Authority (Shurooq), the project has been implemented by a team of experts to restore and protect the flora and fauna of the site.

"The Mleiha dessert landscape is a beautiful yet tough environment to survive in. The fauna and flora that call this place home have had to adapt to a desert that has scorching hot summers and cool wet winters. This has led to many interesting adaptations in the wildlife and plant life found on the dunes and rocky outcrops of Mleiha," said Tharindu K.W.A., a wildlife expert at the centre.

The Mleiha region teems with life of all shapes and sizes. Many fascinating species of mammals, reptiles, insects, plants and desert succulents have cleverly adapted themselves to the harsh environs and made it their home for hundreds of thousands of years.


With water being a major limiting factor, the desert plants here have adapted to survive with whatever is available. "Plants like the Umbrella thorn acacia (Acacia tortilis) have shrunk the size of their leaves to reduce water loss and have developed massive thorns to keep predatory grazers away. UAE's national tree, the Ghaf (Prosopis cineraria) survives the arid conditions in the dunes by sinking roots extremely deep into the earth to reach the underground water aquifers," said Tharindu. You can also find the beautiful Arabian primrose and the aptly named popcorn plant here, a sight that will make one rethink the idea of a desert being a barren region.

Animals look underground for relief as well, with most species living underground in burrows or rocky crevices to escape the heat of the day, only coming out at night when its cooler.

Tharindu said: "Some species like the sand fish (Scincus

mitranus) and sand boa (Eryx jayakari) avoid the sun altogether, simply living under the sand for most of their lives, 'swimming' through the sand to get around and find food."

Many species of insects such as blister beetles, cuckoo wasps and jewel beetles, among many others, can sometimes disrupt the calm serenity of the desert with their busy activity. Donkeys and camels have made this their natural habitat and can be seen roaming around freely. However, the famous Arabian red fox is a stealthy resident and rarely spotted as it chooses to forage the deserts at night.

Tharandu said: "There is much to learn about these plants and animals along with so much more at the Mleiha Archaeological Centre. We have many packages that cater to the wildlife enthusiast in all of us. Whether it be our fauna and

flora workshops or the early morning nature hike that comes with our overnight camps, there is a lot to see and learn. So, come join us at Mleiha and have an expert from our education team teach you about this stunning piece of UAE's desert landscape."

Apart from the Adventure Trek package, the centre also has the Archaeological Tour package, where you can tour different man-made buildings –

forts, cemeteries, the communal kitchen, among others – from various historical periods, as well as visit natural formations nearby such as Fossil Rock, Valley of the Caves, and Camel Rock.

The centre's well-curated exhibitions, interactive displays and artefacts provide an introduction to the past and allows you to travel back thousands of years to see the UAE in its nascent stages of existence. There are several sports packages as well for adrenaline junkies, including



dune bashing, all specially designed keeping in mind the eco-sensitive nature of the region.

All the guides are either palaeontologists, archaeologists, history enthusiasts or wildlife experts.

Let students study in their own ways

Still I have dreadful memories of my struggling with Mathematics, when I was a school student some 30 years ago. I couldn't grasp the concepts or do the problems. My parents tried different ways to improve my Math's marks by sending me to at least 4 tutors and bought a study guide that contains many solved problems. However, I couldn't tame the bull and finally, somehow I got through the grade 10 Mathematics exam. However, I like language and Social Studies and scored well in those subjects.

I understood that Mathematics is not my cup of tea. Teachers branded me as a lower achiever in Mathematics and told me that I have a low IQ. Those days, high IQ level was attributed to students who score high marks in Mathematics.

On the other hand, many of my classmates who were toppers in Mathematics were struggling to learn subjects such as languages, History, Geography and Politics. I still remember, a humorous comment by my grade 10 classmate that, if he get a choice between climbing mount Everest or memorising hundreds of names and dates in History, he would opt for the former. Ironically he was number smart and scored always 'A grades' in Mathematics.

Still recently, our schools followed an age old concept of teaching and learning that killed the skills and talents of millions of students because they were either not good at numbers or memorizing huge chunk of dates, theories and facts.

Due to overemphasis on only 2 intelligence or learning skills ie Linguistic intelligence ("Ability to learn languages, theory subjects such as history, geography ") and Logical-mathematical intelligence ("Ability to learn Mathematics, Physics, statistics, Accountancy etc."), many gifted children with different intelligence type end up being labelled as low achievers.

Traditional schooling nipped millions of budding artists, actors, poets, novelists, musicians, naturalists, social workers, anchors, designers, dancers, therapists, entrepreneurs, and others in the bud, who could have enrich the world in which we live.

Unfortunately, many children who have these gifts don't receive much support and encouragement for them in school. In our school days many objectionable terms were used by teachers to describe the students as 'donkey, dull, deaf, dump or good for nothing' that would be enough to land them in jail for mental torture in our present scenario.

However Dr. Howard Gardner, professor of education at Harvard University with his path breaking theory of multiple intelligences, which developed in 1983, opened a new era in teaching and learning. He rejected the traditional concept that lay emphasis on only two skills ie. Linguistic intelligence ("word smart") and Logicalmathematical intelligence ("number/reasoning smart"). Dr. Gardner proposes eight different intelligences to recognise wide range of human potential in children and adults. Linguistic intelligence - learning through reading, reciting, composing poems, writing stories, essays

- Logical-mathematical intelligence learning through logic, reasoning and systems
- Spatial intelligence learning through pictures, maps, multimedia, mind maps, diagrams and charts.
- Bodily-Kinesthetic intelligence Learning through hands on activities, project works, making models, games, role play etc.
- Musical intelligence Learning through songs, poems, musical games, musical instruments etc.
- Interpersonal intelligence Group projects, collaboration and team work.
- Intrapersonal intelligence Self-study, reading, reflections and thinking.
- Naturalist intelligence Gardening, cultivation, field trips, experiments with plants and animals, observing natural phenomena etc.

His new theory of multiple intelligence, made revolutionary changes in the way teaching and learning in schools. Each person has different learning preferences and styles that benefit them.

Parents should be aware that, their child has different intelligence, therefore don't insist on a particular style of learning. Let them study in their own learning way that conform to their intelligence type.

In addition to this, multiple intelligence theory is applicable for your children, when selecting a right career for them.

A child with musical intelligence must select a career related to music and a child with bodily –Kinesthetic intelligence can opt for a career in

sports. So, parents next time when you scold your child for poor Mathematical skill or language learning ability, remember your son or daughter may have a different intelligence level and you need to encourage and support your child in that area.



Intellectual disability (ID) and Role of an Occupational Therapist



Once known as mental retardation. intellectual disability (ID)is characterised bv below-average intelligence or mental ability and a lack of skills necessary for day-today living. People with intellectual disabilities can and do learn new skills, but they learn them more slowly. There are varying degrees of intellectual disability, from mild to profound.

What is intellectual disability?

Someone with ID has limitations in two areas:

- Intellectual functioning (IQ) less than 70 to 75
- Adaptive behaviours These are skills necessary for day-to-day life, such as being able to communicate effectively, interact with others, and take care of oneself.

What are the signs of intellectual disability in children?

There are many different signs of intellectual disability in children. Signs may appear during infancy, or they may not be noticeable until a child reaches school age. It often depends on the severity of the disability. Some of the most common signs of intellectual disability are:

- Rolling over, sitting up, crawling, or walking late
- Talking late or having trouble with talking
- Slow to master things like potty training,

dressing, and feeding himself or herself Difficulty remembering things etc

What causes intellectual disability?

The most common causes of intellectual disability are:

- Genetic conditions.
- Problems during pregnancy.
- Problems during childbirth.
- Infection or injury etc

Occupational Therapy Intervention

To measure a child's adaptive behaviours, an occupational therapist will observe the child's skills and compare them to other children of the same age. Things that may be observed include how well the child can feed or dress themselves (activity of daily living) and how the child interacts with family, friends, and other children of the same age.

Occupational therapy interventions for people with intellectual disabilities are specifically adapted to the child with respect to the degree and type of support needed as well as the context. Interventions may include direct treatment as well as environmental adaptations, guidance, monitoring and counselling the family members, activities of daily living, learning, work, play, leisure and social participation, assistive technology, accessibility and environmental modification.

Conclusion

Intellectual disability is thought to affect about 1% of the population. Of those affected, 85% have mild intellectual disability. This means they are just a little slower than average to learn new



information or skills. With the right support from professionals, most will be able to live independently as adults.

Sun Damage

up suddenly. So always use a sunscreen on your face and hands. Look for a sunscreen that protects from both UVA and UVB rays. Always protect your eyes too with good quality sunglasses.

How can natural products be Answer to Eternal Youth?

Air conditioning is dehydrating and causes dry skin – you may need to use a gentle exfoliant to remove dead skin so that your moisturizer can do some work. Exfoliators should only be used at night as the new skin can be easily damaged by sunshine. It is very important to moisturize your skin at night and I recommend a skin oil, as oils are more easily absorbed than creams; then you can wake up to lovely soft skin. It is also important to use a moisturizer on your lips such as Vaseline, which keeps the moisture in; and always have a bottle of water by your bed.

The Battle of the Bulge



A little known fact of astounding importance in healthcare in the world today, is that the white powder of sugar kills several thousand times the number of humans as the white powder of gunpowder in battles and wars across the world. Also, Obesity, or an increased fat mass of the body, accounts for a huge number of deaths and disabilities all over the world.

What is more frightening, is that, some areas of Geo political affluence, like the USA and the middle east, have been singled out for further attack by the twin evil forces of fat and sugar, or obesity and diabetes. Indeed, so many patients suffer from a combination of diabetes and obesity, that a term called diabesity is now widely accepted. Compared to Europe and Africa, the Middle East suffers from a much higher percentage of diabetes and obesity. Of course, statistically, India is racing towards a position that is described as the diabetic capital of the world. These are sobering statistics, and numbers that point to a progressive decline in general health parameters in the affected countries.

Why has this happened? How have these two diseases silently grabbed the majority of society in the developed countries? The reason, simply stated, is a combination of a sedentary life style, and a diet that is predominantly rich in processed food, especially in carbohydrates. Ever since the agricultural revolution, with the advent of cereals as a staple diet, Homo Sapiens has steadily increased the average BMI of the species, with a tendency to obesity rapidly growing within the last century, with a steep rise in the percentage of processed sugars in our daily diet.

Those societies that are out with the range of a complete processed diet, have managed to beat this increasing trend of diabesity. For example, some of the tribals of New Zealand and South America, who live on predominantly nonprocessed foods, have managed to retain their BMIs intact. A recent study showed that in urban centers in India, there was a rise in obesity that paralleled the opening of fast food and junk food retail outlets in the cities. Indeed the difference seen in diabesity between the rural and the urban statistics are often related to the availability of junk food in the latter.

So then, what is the big deal about being obese? Or, for that matter, being diabetic? Well, in simple terms, there is a significant drop in the quality and quantity of life in patients who are either diabetic, Obese, and even worse in those who are both. Let me state a few facts here. Every 20 seconds, somewhere across the globe, a leg is being amputated because of diabetes involving the blood vessels. Every 30 seconds, a patient goes on dialysis because of diabetes induced kidney failure. Every 40 seconds, one diabetic patient across the world, goes blind because of diabetes induced retinal damage. And, most sobering, every 60 seconds, there is a death directly attributable to the complications of diabetes.

Have I scared you enough? If not, it is time to

look at some of the statistics in relation to the complications of being obese. When a person has a BM I of over 40, he or she is said to be morbidly obese, which means in possession of a fatness (or obesity) that could lead to an early death. Obesity increases the risk of cancer by a factor of 10, and increasing BMI is one of the cited examples of an increase in breast cancer, colon cancer, pancreatic cancer, and uterine cancer. The effects of obesity on the joints are wellknown. There is a hugely increased need for knee replacements and hip replacements in those who are obese. Severe snoring and falling asleep in the daytime, a combination known as obstructive sleep apnea, often accounts for sudden deaths in those who are pathologically fat. The risks of death due to cardiovascular disease, brain strokes, and after even a minor surgery because of inability to breathe sufficiently and expand their lungs are all swords of Damocles that are constantly hanging over the heads of fat individuals, waiting to fall upon them on a fateful day. A classic study



followed several thousand obese individuals over 20 years in the USA, comparing those who had undergone bariatric surgery to reduce their weight drastically, with those who opted out of surgery. Instead of continuing the trial for 20 years, the authorities in the USA shut down the trial after 15 years, because of a wide difference between the two groups in terms of survival, rendering it almost unfair for obese people to manage them without surgery!

Now that we know that these diseases have come upon us in a big way, what can we do to get rid of this? Well, the good news is that help is at hand! In patients who have a BM I of 40 (BMI is calculated by dividing weight by height squared, Weight in kilograms and height in meters.), who have failed to respond to diet and lifestyle management (which, in my experience of the past 17 years, happens in more than 90% of all obese patients!) then they could be extremely well benefited by a laparoscopic bariatric surgery.

> This number of 40 actually drops down to a BMI of 35, if there are significant comorbidities, like diabetes and hypertension and dyslipidemia, or high cholesterol or triglyceride levels.

> These operations have now become much easier on the patients, with the advent of keyhole surgery techniques, or laparoscopic surgery techniques. Usina hiahresolution telescopes and cameras put into long cylinders through multiple keyholes in the body, a bloodless, fairly pain-free, and highly successful bariatric surgery can be performed on individuals, appropriate wellchosen and worked up towards surgery. Also, in the last decade, the awareness has blossomed. of incredibly beneficial effects of these surgeries on the overall metabolic health of the patient. For example, in up to 90% of

patients who undergo a laparoscopic bariatric surgery, the diabetes goes into long-term remission, and, sometimes, the patient requires no further anti-diabetic treatment for the rest of his or her life. So also, it is a gratifying fact that up to 95% of patients drop their cholesterol and triglycerides to normal levels, as also hypertensive, who returns to normal blood pressure levels. Indeed, medication for BP, diabetes, cholesterol, and triglyceride, is often completely stopped after the performance of these procedures, in a short period itself after surgery.

What about the risks of bariatric surgery? The truth is that one out of several hundred to 1000 patients may have a serious complication, sometimes even resulting in death. But this usually occurs in the most morbidly obese patients, often in those above the weight of 200 kg. It also happens in those who have delayed the surgery by many years, allowing the comorbidities to clog up the blood vessels of the heart and the brain, resulting in complications related to these bloods this is being blocked, occurring after surgery. Also, in patients who are very obese, a period of immobility around the surgical procedure, could trigger off clotting in the veins of the leg, giving rise, sometimes, to serious complications, despite anti-clotting measures that are used.

Suffice it to say, that if a patient is worked up in great detail, by a combination of a bariatric surgeon, a physician, physio therapist, dietician, and, if necessary, an intensivist and a lung specialist, the overall percentage risk of the surgery is something like 0.1%, or one in 1000. It is sad and unfortunate that in developing societies, there is a huge focus on complications of bariatric surgery, rather than on its successes. Several studies have shown that the number of lives saved by appropriately performed bariatric and metabolic surgery, outnumbered by a factor of several thousand, lives lost out of complications.

What are the types of these surgeries? Broadly speaking, there are two types of bariatric or metabolic surgery .One type of operation is restrictive, in which the size of the stomach is restricted to about 20% of its total size, bringing down the amount of food it is possible to eat. The other type of operation involves bypassing the divided stomach by joining it to the intestines below, in such a way that the absorption of sugar and fat from the small intestine is deliberately interfered with. It is the latter type of operation, or the bypass operation, that carries a stronger impact on correcting the altered metabolism of these patients. When a bypass is utilized for a patient who is not very fat, but suffers from metabolic derangement like high cholesterol, blood pressure, blood sugar, or triglyceride, then that operation is known as a metabolic surgery. Indeed, in recent years, there has been a huge burgeoning of surgeries being done for metabolic reasons, rather than fat alone.

These patients need to be followed up on a regular basis, to prevent them from falling into the temptation of binge eating, or sweet eating, and a good dietician for a regular follow-up, with apt and well-timed reference back to the bariatric team, is an essential component of the follow-up program. 



Siberian postal worker's monster truck gives lifeline to tiny village

Only five other people live in 56-year-old Galina Yermolova's tiny Siberian village Pikhtovoye, isolated from the world by the dense taiga swampy coniferous forest - and a swamp.

Every week, she travelled 16 kilometers by tractor taking three hours through the forest to the nearest post office in a larger village to collect the post, supplies and pensions for her neighbours. The couple's son recently gave them a lifechanging gift: a huge-wheeled monster truck built by a friend that can plough through the muddy tracks much faster so with husband Yermolova, they can now reach the post office in an hour.

Once in the bigger village of Imshegal, home to around 100 people, Yermolova loads basic goods, which have already come from a town some 100 kilometers away, onto her truck.



Youngest ever swimmer crosses Qiongzhou Strait

9-year-old girl Zhou Yihan beat back attacks by jelly fish and overcame high seas to successfully

swim 26.7 kilometers across the Qiongzhou Strait separating South China's Guangdong Province and Hainan Province.

Zhou Yihan is the youngest on record to swim the strait, spending 13 hours in the water.

Zhou started swimming with nine adults in the early hours of August 7 and soon ran into difficulty. She was stung more than 20 times by jelly fish, before her parents in an escort boat managed to drive them away. Next came unexpectedly high seas that stalled her forward progress.

Her parents wanted their daughter to end her swim, but the girl told them, "I won't give up."



Italian postman never rings once, hoards mail instead

Italian police arrested a postman from the northern town of Vicenza after finding more than half a ton of undelivered mail stashed away in his garage.

Police were called in when workers from a recycling plant were sent to empty the garage and found 43 yellow plastic postal containers stuffed full of letters, bills, bank statements and even electoral pamphlets dating back to 2010.

The postman, who was not named, was 56 and came from the southern city of Naples, police said. They added that it was the largest ever haul of undelivered mail in Italy. The Vicenza postal service has promised to deliver the huge pile of post, albeit several years late





73-year-old woman gives birth in India

An Indian woman who gave birth to twin girls via C-section is believed to be the oldest person to ever give birth after having the babies at the age of 73.

Erramatti Mangayamma and her husband, E. Raja Rao, 80, have been together since 1962, but were unable to conceive through natural means. Umashankar said the couple sought assistance from his clinic in 2018 and he agreed to give them a round of IVF treatment when initial tests showed signs of possible success.

Umashankar said the pregnancy was free of complications, owing largely to the fact that Mangayamma doesn't have diabetes, hypertension or other conditions that could make a pregnancy at her age particularly dangerous.



978 students perform floss dance for Guinness World Record

A British school was awarded a Guinness World Record when 978 students came together to person the popular floss dance simultaneously. The students at Montgomery Academy in the Bispham area of Blackpool, England, came together to perform the viral dance move, popularized by the video game Fortnite, and Guinness said they successfully broke the world record. The previous record was 792 dancers, Guinness said.

"In the week leading up to the attempt both staff and pupils put lots of work in to get their flossing up to scratch! If you think it's easy, then give it a try," principal Steve Careless told a Blackpool newspaper. "We are proud we have lived up to our school motto of 'inspiring excellence together."



Man fined for driving with car strapped to top of car

A Welsh driver was ordered to pay a fine after he was caught on video transporting a disabled car by balancing it on the roof of another car.

Glyndwr Wyn Richards, 51, pleaded guilty in Aberystwyth Magistrates' Court to using a vehicle with a load likely to cause danger of injury after he was caught on video driving his Volkswagen Passat with a Skoda Octavia strapped to its roof.

Richards had been driving through an industrial estate in Aberystwyth, Wales, and he told the court he transported the car less than 1,000 feet. He admitted the stunt was a "stupid thing to do."

Richards was given three penalty points on his driver's license and ordered to pay a \$97 fine and \$140 in court costs.

Fujairah Fort



The Emirate of Fujairah is rich in archaeological treasures, some dating back to about five centuries including castles, forts, towers and mosques. These forts and castles were used to defend the invaders and repel them, thus maintaining the integrity of the Fujairah identity.

Fujairah Fort is one of the most important and largest forts in the emirate. Located on a high hill in the old Fujairah region, the fort of Fujairah was about 20 meters above sea level, overlooking the entire city of Fujairah and was three kilometres away from the coast.

Fort design: The fort design is quite different from the usual engineering designs of the rest of the forts in the UAE. It consists of three circular towers, a fourth square tower and a long unit that looks like a tower, and is connected to a wall between the towers to form a central hall in the middle. This irregular design emerged as one of many characteristics, shaped like the rocks where the Fujairah Fort was built.

The fort was made with a selection of materials including stone, clay and *alsarooj* substance (gypsum). A chemical analysis of carbon study 14, which proved that the fort was built during the period from 1500 and 1550 AD and rebuilt from 1650 to 1700 AD.

The fort was first renovated in 1925, and another renovation was carried out in the mid-60s due to the collapse of the north tower and square: from 1998 to 2000, used the same materials in the renovation from which the fort was built. (Mud, gravel, gypsum, wood)

Emirati jiu-jitsu competitors total haul of medals in LA to 51



Emirati competitors continued to win medals on the second consecutive day of the third round of the fifth Abu Dhabi Grand Slam Jiu-Jitsu Championship held in Los Angeles, US, winning eight medals that included two golds, three silvers and three bronzes, bringing their tournament total to 51, with 20 gold, 16 silver, and 15 bronze.

Mohammed Al Kuwaiti, Acting Consul of the UAE in Los Angeles, Tariq Al Bahri, Director of the Abu Dhabi Grand Slam Tours, Khalid Al Hinai, Chief Operating Officer of the Al Wahda Club and Supervisor of the Jiu-Jitsu Academy, and Gustavo Mudjari, President of the American Jiu-Jitsu Federation, attended the matches and crowned the winners.

At the end of the tournament, Brazil led the country rankings with 19,240 points, with the US coming second with 17,980 points, followed by the UAE in third with 10,020 points, Mexico in fourth with 2,120 points, and Canada in fifth with 520 points.

In the list of competing academies, Brazil's Atos came in first place with 6,160 points, followed by the Al Wahda Club in second place with 5,200 points, with Brazil's Allianz coming in third place with 3,520 points, the Brazilian GF Team in fourth with 3,160 points, and Checkmat from the US in fifth with 3,140 points.



CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the U.A.E. official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

<u>Credit cards:</u> Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)
