
Ruler of Fujairah: Commissioning of Barakah Nuclear Energy Plant goes down in the annals of history

About:

Stamps of Fujeira: CHAPTER 1 - The First Definitive Set

Introduction: Fujeira, the only Trucial State not touching the Persian Gulf, was considered part of Oman. In 1952, the British Government accepted Fujeira as an autonomous State and signed the same treaties with Britain as the other Trucial States – including the Exclusive Agreement allowing Britain to conduct all their foreign relations.

This is the story of the Postal System in Fujeira till integration into the United Arab Emirates in 1972. On 1st April 1973, all Fujeira stamps lost their validity and replaced by the UAE stamps.

Before the Post Office opened in Fujeira

Before the first Post Office was opened in Fujeira, the locals used a courier Saeed Mohammed Tanaji to take letters to Kuwait and Saudi Arabia and collect mail on his way back to Fujeira. Secondly, there was also a grocery named Abdul Rasak Grocery. They would accept mails from locals and take it to Dubai to be sent out. He would also collect any mails for locals from the Dubai Post Office. This information was obtained from locals and unfortunately, there are no letters known from this period to confirm this.

To announce the issue of their first stamps, covers were sent out in August 1964 franked with the value-only overprinted stamps of the 'British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia' and cancelled with the large hexagonal Fujeira Postmark. It is said that this was quite improper since these stamps were never supplied to Fujiera nor was there ever a British Postal Agency there. It is worth noting that at this time, the Fujeira 'Postal Service' consisted of nothing more than a rented PO Box in the Dubai Post Office!

The Trucial States Issue

In 1960, the Trucial States agreed to produce a stamp issue that would be used by all Sheikdoms. Unfortunately, when the designs were ready for printing, the smaller states were not happy that their country was represented by a smaller palm tree than the bigger states. As a result, the issue was produced and only used in Dubai. The other States continue using the 'British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia' stamps.

The set was issued on 7th January 1961. It comprised of 7 values with this design and 4 higher values depicting the 'Dhow'. The lower values were issued by Harrison by Photogravure and the

dhows were recess printed by De La Rue.

The Baroody Essays

In 1963, each of the Trucial States were planning to issue stamps of their own. The Ruler of Fujeira signed agreements with the Baroody Stamp Co of Beirut (Lebanon) by which the company will open a small post office and pay the Ruler a moderate sum for the concession of printing and marketing their stamps. This was announced in the report issued every month by the Political Agent for England – *Refer to Fig 1.2*.

Essays were made for Fujeira (and also Ajman and Umm Al Qiwain) by the Baroody Stamp Company. These essays were designed by M.M. Arthur and produced by NCR Litho at the same time as the first issue of Dubai (similar design).

For Fujeira, four designs were used, The Leopard, The Grouse; Falcon on a branch and Flacon on the ground. Various colour combinations exist for each stamp – including red and white; blue and white; blue and red; brown and yellow; red and pink; blue and pink. Please refer to Figure 1.3 for the four designs and some of the colour combinations.

Stamps are known Perforated 12 x 111/2 or

Imperf; and on both gummed or ungummed unwatermarked paper. These stamps were printed containing stamps for the 3 Sheikdoms (Fujeira, Ajman and Umm Al Qiwain) all in 1 sheet. Please refer to Figure 1.4. It is believed that these stamps were produced in late November 1963.

Mr Stephan, the representative of the Baroody Stamp Company, was not easily contactable. Eventually he was found guilty of breaches of contract and in addition had transferred his rights under this agreement to Mr Finbar Kenny of J & H Stolow Inc of New York, without consulting the Ruler. As a result, these stamps were never issued and the original agreement was cancelled. The Ruler was not happy with this arrangement and the new American company was contacted

directly to organize a new contract. This contract was quite advantageous to the Government including article 3 – The Agency will employ a Postmaster and other personnel needed for a basic minimum Postal Service...; Article 13 – the agencies guarantees the Government minimum net revenue of 300,000 Rupees in the first year, 400,000 Rupees during the Second year 500,000 during year 4 and 600,000 for the fifth.... Article 15 stipulated the contract's period is five years.

FUJEIRA Overprint

In the meantime, Mr Finbar Kenny from New York, USA, wanted to produce stamps immediately to recover the costs of buying the contract off Baroody Company. So, he produced these overprints on existing Wilding stamps of the 'British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia' that he had available. Unfortunately, the British Postal Administration rejected the design and they were not accepted for use.

Fujairah overprints were rejected, as made without permission of the British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia. After being rejected, they still came on to the market for philatelic consumption but not valid for use.

The First Set

The first official set was issued on 22 September 1964 consisting of 12 values. Each value had the portrait of Sheikh Mohamed bin Hamad al Sharji, the then ruler of Fujeira on the left. It was printed by 'Heraclio Fournier' of Vitoria in Spain. Stamps were produced by Photogravure in 3 sizes. Close to 500,000 each of the lower values were produced, but only 10,000 of the top values.

within a month of the official post office opening in Fujeira itself. Although philatelic, this is the only cover known to exist with both 'British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia' stamps (without the 'Fujairah' overprint) and the new Fujeira stamps. As explained earlier, the use of the 'British Postal Agencies in Eastern Arabia' were never authorised to be used in Fujeira!

From this first issue, a tradition started where virtually EVERY stamp was produced both perforated and imperforated. The imperf edition was always in limited supply and could ONLY be purchased if a number of perf sets were also bought. The documentation says that the imperfs were used for presentation purposes (whatever that means!). As a result, these imperf versions are much more difficult to obtain. It is believed that only 2,000 imperf sets were produced for this issue.

Another tradition was created by providing Cancelled-to-order perforated stamps at a fraction of the face value directly to dealers. These cancelled-to-order stamps are still available in large quantities and of not much philatelic value. On the other hand, used stamps on covers are greatly sought after and not easy to come by! Unused stamps are also quite difficult to obtain – especially the imperf stamps.

On 14th November 6 additional values were produced in the same format.

On 16 August 1965, another set of 9 stamps was produced using virtually the same designs except that Fujeira and the value are transposed and additionally inscribed 'AIR MAIL's. These were also produced by Fournier.

In October 1965, a new set of 9 was produced, similar in design but with Fujeira and denomination transposed and additionally inscribed 'ON STATE'S SERVICE'.




Fig 1.7 - Letter to Germany dated September 1965 using the correct standard letter rate to Europe (at that time it was 25

A 'tongue in cheek' commentary by NOMAD in the 13th August 1965 issue of Stamp Collecting. Obviously stamps from Fujeira achieved quite notoriety from the start! Imagine the sentiments when up to 10 sets were being produced per month (about 100 stamps) during 1971 and 72! And if that is not enough, each of these stamps were available 'in limited supplies' in imperforate format!

LATE NEWS from "Nomad"

HURRY UP-ONLY 10,000 SETS!

The post has just brought me a most exciting document, and I feel that it would be very selfish if I did not hasten to share the good nows with you. Fujairah Post Office 'Press and Broadcast Notice' dated July 21st, 1965, announces the issue on August 16th of the First Airmail Series—a multi-coloured nine denomination series with a total face value of R.13 (=19s.6d.).

R.13 (=195.03.).
The notice gives details of the six-colour photogravure stamps—the six lowest values measuring 46.5 × 30 mm, and the three highest measuring 37.5 × 37 mm. Now this is real value for money—just think of it, 7249.5 square millimetres of glorious technicolour, and at face value, too! Hurry up—there are only 10,000 sets, and you don't want to miss

these stamps.
But WAIT! But Warr! "Fujairah Post Office"—is there one?
"Press and Broadcast Notice"—no press or radio in
Fujairah! "Fusar Airmail Series"—that's it; there is no Fujaran! "Fusar Aurmail Series"—that's it; there is no airport in Fujarah, and they want one; so you are to be allowed to make the first contribution of £10,000 towards its cost. Further airmail stamps will, no doubt, keep the Exchequer refreshed when you have got this lot safely in your collections

Come to think of it, perhaps there isn't really all that need for haste; none of these stamps will ever be needed for postage, and there can't possibly be 10,000 fools ready to be

parted from their money. Or are there?

However, don't be disheartened, the Fujairah Post Office also announces that other stamps are available—all at face value (but note that remittances must be made " in fully convertible funds ").

convertible funds ").

For instance, there are the Kennedy Memorial stamps for only 18s.5d. with a miniature sheet at the bargain price of 12s.; but " Mail orderers should not ask for more than one souvenir sheet for every two regular series ordered ". Then there is the Olympic Games set for 32s.3d., and remember that " to make the Special series more memorable a quantity of each denomination was left imperforated "! Don't forget the 18 definitives—they will only set you back 37s.6d., and you must get rid of your money somehow.

P.S.—To the Post Office of Fujairah, Fujairah, Arabian Gulf (via Bahrain): —

Gulf (via Bahrain): —

You really are letting your imagination run away with you when you say that the definitive stamps were "placed on sale in the Post Officer ... to replace the overprinted Great Britain Stamps used in this territory previously". G.B. overprinted stamps were never sold in a Post Office that did not exist. Also, you know, "(via Bahrain)" gives the game away! A small point, but may I suggest that, in your next "Press and Broadcast Notice" you spell "Office" correctly in the Arabic—letter; particularly when you consider that, by the omission of the Arabic letter "t", the expression "Post Office" can be misread as "Postal Rubbish Dump".



Fujairah man honoured for saving a person from drowning



Fujairah resident, Mahmoud Rashid Al Kindi has been awarded a certificate of valour by Fujairah Police for rescuing a man from drowning.

Major General Mohammed Ahmed bin Ghanem Al Kaabi, Commander-in-Chief of Fujairah Police, honoured Emirati Mahmoud at the former's office for his courage and his efforts to save a person from drowning in the sea at Fujairah.

When Al Kindi saw a man struggling to stay afloat and frantically wave for help, he rushed to his rescue and fought strong sea currents to rescue him from drowning.

He managed to save the person's life and administered necessary first aid to him, until the national ambulance service arrived with the paramedics.

Major General Al Kaabi praised Al Kindi's courage and bravery and praised his valuable initiative in saving a life. In short to distract them I decided to host all these



Fujairah Business Centre nears completion



Al Taif Investment, the Fujairahbased joint venture between Dubai Investments and Fujairah Investment Establishment, has announced that 85% of work has been completed on its new mixed-use retail, hospitality and residential project, Al Taif Business Centre, and that the project is due for handover by the end of 2020.

The \$114 million project has a total built-up area of 96,400sqm and consists of two towers – hotel

plus residential tower with basement + ground floor + 19 floors and an office tower. The hotel and residences tower will contain a four-star hotel with 228 rooms, including 14 junior suites, operated by Marriott International and 79 apartments featuring one-, two- and three-bedroom units, each semi-furnished with electrical appliances.

Dubai Investments Vice Chairman and CEO Khaled Bin Kalban said: "Al Taif Business Centre project is designed and developed to offer an ideal leisure and business destination in Fujairah and is carefully crafted to meet evolving needs."

As the emirate of Fujairah seeks to diversify its economy, there is increased focus on directing the resources towards enhancing urban development, tourism, retail, and leisure to attract local and international investors, observed Kalban.

Al Taif Mall, the G+2 level shopping mall within the development, is equipped with a basement and a retail area comprising of 39 retail shops' and a supermarket in core and shell set-up, five food outlets, two restaurants with outdoor terrace facilities and an additional 12 stores located in the basement to be used by the retail tenants as a convenient and secured storage area.

The retail spaces on offer are ideally placed within the towers, offering easy accessibility and convenient shopping. The retail parking space is designed to accommodate over 670 vehicles.

The 19-floor office tower is designed to provide office spaces in core and shell set-up, providing options for tailor-made offices to suit varied requirements.

"Developed in accordance with the emirate's strategic vision, Al Taif Business Centre project is counted among the projects that will set a benchmark in the emirate's planned urban development," Kalban said.

"It will act as a catalyst, enhancing the emirate's attractiveness as a fully equipped leisure and business destination," he added.

According to him, Al Taif Business Centre's strategic location was a distinct advantage that the project offered. Located approximately five minutes from Fujairah International Airport, in proximity to the arterial road of Hamad Bin Abdulla, it offers easy connectivity to other Emirates as well as other parts of Fujairah, he concluded.

Toastmasters - Baking cookies Toastmasters style

Let me tell you a secret about me. I am a foodie. It may not show on my face, but I am!

How you can tell if I really care about someone? Easy! You will find me enjoying cooking for them.

And you want to know, if I am enjoying doing something? Hmmm... super easy! I just compare it to food...

'Wow! Look at that yellow dress it is delicious like a spongy saffron cake'

'Ooh! Your baby's cheeks are so soft and tasty like marshmallows'

It is hence my pleasure to invite you to my humble kitchen, where I have chosen to bake the tastiest most delicious chocolate chip cookies.

What is special about these cookies is that these will be baked in the Toastmasters style. So I guarantee you will all love it.

First with the Ingredients:

- 60g butter
- 50g white sugar
- 100g light brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 2 eggs
- 225g dark chocolate
- ½ teaspoon salt
- ¼ teaspoon baking powder
- 40g flour

So let's start our exciting session by melting the butter to keep it ready to be mixed with the other ingredients. As we do in a Toastmasters club, we start our journey by melting our fear of speaking in public by introducing ourselves to audience members and letting go of stage fear.

Now the butter is melted and ready for the sugar. As you may have noticed from the ingredients, we will be using 2 types of sugar. I promise this is not to increase the risk of diabetes but it's essential to have that soft, chewy inside and crunchy, crispy outside.

In toastmasters, our evaluators also mix both types of sugar when providing feedback. We receive soft and crisp feedback from them to help us improve our speaking skills.

Alright, now that we have a beautiful, creamy and heavenly smelling mixture, we add our carefully chosen eggs one by one and continue mixing followed by drops of the vanilla essence to enhance the lovely flavor. Similarly, to enrich your toastmasters journey with a special flavor, you need to select a specific path from 10 different flavors that are called Pathways which you will find on the Toastmasters International website www.toastmasters.org.

To continue, we now add the melted chocolate. Let me inform you that you have the freedom to choose any type either dark, milk or white chocolate as we do in toastmasters where we enjoy the absolute liberty of choosing our speech topics whether educational, humorous, heath oriented etc.

A word of caution, however, respecting the audience is a huge part of speaking and hence we must avoid 3 topics known as taboos in respect of the multicultural and diverse audience.

Please excuse me, when I start talking about toastmasters I forget the time and go on talking non-stop.

Now let's get back to the kitchen and our beautiful cookies. To enhance the flavours, we add a pinch of salt.

As done in toastmasters, in order to enhance your speeches, you can use technology (PowerPoints, videos) etc.

We then add the baking powder to the mixture followed by the flour. For perfectly raised cookies, never forget the backing powder while the flour helps bring all the previously used ingredients together.

As in toastmasters, to constantly raise ourselves to become better speakers we need to practice, practice and practice. It's also important to come together with all the members and exchange knowledge and experience through regular attendance of meetings.

Now it's the time for the secret ingredient that will take your cookies to the next level. Peanut, dark or white chocolate chips! They are tiny little surprises hidden in the heart of your cookies that will give them an unforgettable taste.

Our mentors are these hidden gems in our Toastmasters journey. They work behind the scenes to help us discover ourselves as speakers in ways that will surprise us.

A small secret to getting smooth and symmetrically shaped cookies are the dough rest/cooling period in the refrigerator before baking.

Similarly in toastmasters, we need to be cool and comfortable before and after delivering our speeches.

After refrigeration, it's now time to bake our cookies in a preheated oven under 180° C for 10-15 minutes

My favourite part has as now arrived. Enjoying these beautifully made cookies.

Shurooq announces four eco-inspired tourism projects in Khorfakkan, Kalba, Al Dhaid and Mleiha



His Excellency Marwan bin Jassim ΑI Sarkal. Executive Chairman of Shariah Investment and Development Authority (Shuroog), yesterday revealed during a recent live interview on Shariah TV that the Authority will be undertaking four new large-scale tourism and hospitality projects in Khorfakkan, Kalba, Al Dhaid and Mleiha The strategic undertaking follows Shuroog's vision of transforming Shariah as a leading hub of nature-inspired experiences. and brings the emirate's central and eastern regions within the folds of its ambitious plans.

Al Sarkal has noted that the new developments follow the wise directives of His Highness Sheikh Dr. Sultan bin Muhammad Al Qasimi, Member of the Supreme Council and Ruler of Sharjah, to materialise key infrastructural projects which would further boost Sharjah's appeal as a go-to

destination for as well overseas travellers as well as UAE citizens and residents by allowing them access to the unique heritage and diverse natural landscapes that make up the many cities and regions of the culturally rich emirate.

Pointing out that the new projects are being rolled out in response to a sharp increase in touristic and leisure activities and demand for new experiences in the emirate, Al Sarkal emphasised that they are being designed to fulfil His Highness's directives to ensure greater economic opportunities and prosperity for those residing in these regions.

He noted: "We are all set to begin the construction of two five-star hotels at scenic locations in Sharjah's eastern region – the first 66-key property will be located along the Khorfakkan Beach and be home to the city's first waterpark. The second one will stand adjacent to Kalba Waterfront, the major retail project being developed in phases by Shuroog and Eagle Hills."

He explained: "The two hotels are being developed to promote both Sharjah's tourism and investment appeal, in the eastern region in particular. Shurooq has been at the forefront of advocating for



responsible investments to promote sustainable, diversified and cross-sectoral growth, and we believe these new projects will offer investors in retail, tourism, hospitality and real-estate lucrative and high-yielding opportunities."

Al Sarkal also revealed that Shurooq will be developing a 60-key experiential family retreat within the 14 sqkm Seih Al Bardi Kabeer safari park project Sharjah is currently developing in the interiors of Al Dhaid. Character Formation in Children




Many parents are worried about the behavior of their children. The behavioural issues led to conflict between parents and children at homes. teachers students and at schools and among peers. Unfortunately many parents clueless. They don't know how to tackle the behavioural problems and often resort to physical punishment.

Recently I came across a mother of a fifteen year old boy and she is almost shattered by the issues created by her son at home and school. The boy was good natured and gentle until teens. His parents noticed rebellious nature in their son. He started to back answer and disobey. In school he was involved in verbal abuse and violent fight with his classmates. Moreover, he lost his interest in studies and addicted to internet games and social media. Parents tried all methods at their disposal such as advice, scolding, beating, denying internet and so on. However the boy was more rebellious and became a headache to parents and teachers. This is not a rare case instead, many parents are suffering from the bad behavior of their kids. Surprisingly, bad behavior is not an exclusive

issue of boys, many girls also make their parents and teacher unhappy by their disobedience and negative character.

The following behavioural issues are commonly found in children.

- Inattention means a person wanders off task, lacks persistence, has difficulty sustaining focus.
- Attention deficit hyperactivity disorder (ADHD): Kids with ADHD have trouble with, paying attention, listening, sitting still, and waiting their turn.
- Aggressive behavior: These are behaviors that threaten or cause physical harm and may include fighting, bullying, being cruel to others or animals, using weapons, and forcing another into sexual activity.
- Opposition defiant disorder (ODD) is a disorder found primarily in children and adolescents. They are easily angered and may seem to be angry much of the time. Such children to blame all their problems on others.
- Destructive behaviour: This involves intentional destruction of property at home or at school. They may throw things in a fit of rage or deliberately involve in destruction of things of others.





- Deceitful behaviour: This may include repeated lying, shoplifting, or breaking into homes or cars in order to steal.
- Violation of rules: This involves going against accepted rules of society. These behaviors may include running away, skipping school and playing pranks.

Importance of Character

Character formation in the childhood days are vital. Proverb (22:6) says 'Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it. The scripture ways points to the role of parents, teachers and elders in molding the character of young ones.

The words of Billy Graham 'When wealth is lost, nothing is lost; when health is lost, something is lost, when character is lost, all is lost' is very relevant. Also the words of an unknown author who said 'Be careful of your thoughts, for your thoughts become your words; be careful of your words, for your words become your deeds; be careful of your deeds, for your deeds become your habits; be careful of your habits, for your habits become your character; be careful of your character, for your character becomes your destiny.'

The aim of parents should be improve society and lives of children by improving their values, attitude, choices, actions and character. Behaviour is the result of values, beliefs, mindsets and attitudes that control our actions.

Steps to form good character

 Inculcating values: Character formation is by way of making positive change. Most effective way of changing someone is instilling or strengthening values. Values are the building blocks of Character and shape the nature and quality of our personal and social interactions. Values are adopted by way of teaching and advice of parents, teachers, peers and elders, role models, social traditions and inherited values. The moral science classes in schools are an

- example for inculcating values.
- Thinking: To change the way people behave, you have to first change the way they think. Always try to encourage positive thinking in children.
- Beliefs and attitudes: The best way to changing behavior is to change the beliefs and attitudes.
- Choice: Develop ability to choose option that achieves the best possible result
- Encouragement: Promote wise and ethical conduct by rewarding for good behaviour.
- Avoid physical punishment: Spanking can never be effective weapons for disciplining your children. It will make your children more angry and violent.
- Contract: The child and the parents can make contracts that punish unwanted behaviours. For example, the child may lose a privilege such an outing with his friends or not allowing to go for evening football match.
- Be a role model: Teachers and parents are the role model for children, therefore always display good behaviour and show the children why good behaviour is beneficial and productive.

Fujairah hospital does the first-of-its-kind laproscopic procedure



In the first-ever reported case of minimal invasive surgery to extract an 8cm cyst from the liver, a UAE surgeon was able to resect a portion of the liver of a 49-year-old woman, laparoscopically.

The patient, Christy Bai Gnanamai Parimala, a music teacher at a Fujairah-based school, had been suffering from abdominal swelling, breathlessness, pain and nausea and had lost her appetite for many days. The baseball-sized cyst contained live worms that were growing within the membrane after this music teacher had inhaled them from the faeces of her pet dog.

The three-hour keyhole surgery recently took place at the Thumbay Hospital in Fujairah.

What are Hydatid cysts?

Providing details of the case, Dr Raj Kumar, surgeon and specialist, minimal invasive surgery,

told Gulf News: "Hydatid cysts are relatively rare in the UAE. These are caused when a person inhales or ingests microscopic larvae of the dog tapeworm (*Echinococcus granulosus*) excreted through the faeces of the animal. The larvae from a cyst that is attached to the liver continues to grow as the worms grow. This cyst can be fatal if it ruptures because as it releases the larvae into the blood stream. The liquid from the ruptured cyst can be highly toxic.

Hydatid disease is fairly common in some parts of Saudi Arabia, Australia, parts of the United States and in the Indian subcontinent."

The traditional procedure is to cut open the abdomen to extract the cyst. The minimally invasive surgery, carried out for cyst extraction in the Middle East, helps extract the cyst and parts of the infected liver through minor punctures on the abdominal area. This not only gives a better cosmetic outcome, but also accelerates healing, allowing the patient to resume a normal life within a week.



Cyst growing for 10 years

Parimala's son, Jeremiah Caleb Henry said the cyst must have formed more than ten years ago.

"My mother came here ten years ago to teach at the school. Prior to that, in Chennai, India, we had a pet German Shepherd dog and we presume that the source of this larvae was that pet which was eventually given away when she moved here."

Henry said the cyst was spotted two-and-a-half years ago during a routine CT scan.

"My mother had suffered from lower-back pain two-and-a-half years ago and during the scan, the doctor had spotted this tiny cyst, which he said was a common cyst that would go away with time. But for the last few months, my mother was complaining of something poking her stomach as the cyst was pressing from the liver on to her abdominal wall. Since she was in pain, discomfort, breathlessness and experienced loss of appetite, she underwent a CT scan – only to discover that the cyst had grown to be 8x7cm."

After surgery, Parimala said that the pain had subsided and she could no longer feel the poking sensation in her tummy.



Laparoscopic Surgery

Laparoscopy is just one of the many new and innovative approaches in a new era of surgery encompassing minimal intervention. Simply put, many complicated problems required large incisions to gain access to a very focal area. Minimally invasive surgery gains access to that same area without a large incision. Laparoscopic surgery refers to procedures in minimally invasive surgery isolated to the abdomen.

Laparoscopic surgery requires only small puncture holes for insertion of various operating instruments.

Early experience in laparoscopy was gained by gynecologists performing tubal ligation by looking through a small telescope inserted through the umbilicus (belly button). In the late 1980s, technology evolved to a point where the images could be projected onto TV screens.

Laparoscopic surgery has evolved tremendously over the last 10 to 20 years. A variety of complicated procedures are now able to be performed laparoscopically with less post-operative pain, faster recovery, and smaller scars than traditional open operations.

Benefits of Laparoscopic Surgery

The advent of laparoscopic procedures revolutionized surgery in many ways. Procedures that required weeks to recover from were dramatically reduced in many ways.

A few of the benefits are:



Story

- Stories help to improve sentence construction and vocabulary. Ask questions about the pictures on each page, the character, what will happen next, etc.
- Target like Who, what, where, when, how, why.
- Read the same books more than once to make the child familiar with the words and to give more exposure to the vocabulary.
- Gradually encourage your child to narrate the story.

Playtime

- Join your children during playtime; engage and talk about the game or toys. Describe the toy for example while playing with animal models name them, describe where they live, or what they eat, etc.
- Work on skills like turn-taking, requesting, identifying, and labelling.
- Provide a variety of age-appropriate toys with various motor actions and vocabulary targets. Involve your child in pretend play.

Daily Routine

- Bombard your child with language throughout the day. Talk to your child during mealtimes, when they get dressed, brush their teeth, or during bath time.
- Provide language opportunities to your child. For example, give two choices. Make way for a verbal response rather than a head nod or yes/no. (i.e. do you want milk or water?)



- Work on sequencing skills (first, then, last), following directions (peel, cut, mix, grind, shake) naturally and in a fun way.

Parents have many opportunities to interact with their children in everyday situations. If utilized effectively, every interaction will serve as a building block to develop your child's speech and language skills.



You can improve your health by making water your first and main drink of the day.



Researchers teaching robots to write a stage play in Czech Republic

A team of artificial intelligence researchers are teaming with theater professionals in the Czech Republic to create the world's first play written entirely by "robots."

Researcher Rudolf Rosa of Charles University said his team is working together with Svanda Theater and the Academy of Performing Arts in Prague on the project, dubbed *THEaiTRE*.

Rosa said the idea was suggested by entrepreneur Tomas Studenik as a means of celebrating the 100th anniversary of R.U.R., aka Rossum's Universal Robots, a 1921 play by Karel and Josef Capek that is credited with originating the term "robot."

"Tomas thought that this should be properly celebrated and came up with the idea of turning

the story around: 100 years ago, a man wrote a theater play about robots; what if today, robots wrote a theater play about men?" Rosa stated.

He said the team is working with artificial intelligence models that were previously successful in generating pieces of text, including poetry and dialogue.

"Thanks to the approaching anniversary, our main target is clear and fixed: by January 2021, we need to have a play ready for premiere," Rosa said.

He said the team is aiming to have a script finished in September to give the theater group time to turn it into a full-fledged production.

"Even though we are developing a general tool for theater script generation, at the moment we only really need to generate one script," he said.



Man proposes to girlfriend with hundreds of candles, burns down their home

A man's romantic gesture went up in flames quite literally - when he inadvertently burned down the apartment he shared with his girlfriend while setting up for a proposal. The British man, who has not been named, was planning to propose to his girlfriend. To do so, he lit hundreds of tea lights in their apartment, filled it with balloons and poured out wine in glasses. Dubai Rugby 7s 2020 floats plans for scaled-down event



Plans are in place for a "scaled-down" Emirates Airline Dubai 7s 2020 this December.

Last month it was announced that the HSBC World Sevens Series would not be running in Dubai due to the global COVID-19 pandemic and the effect on global team logistics.

"We are going to celebrate all levels of participation. Crowds will be wowed by the skills of the teams from across the region set to backdrop that will still inspire memories from years past and set a tone for the future as we look forward to 2021. There will be health and safety measures in place, and the setup will be amended from previous years to adapt to that."

"This might mean some extra patience is required from visitors and a personal responsibility taken but this will be no different to the 'new normal' that we face in everyday life. We are excited to deliver a brilliantly unique Emirates Airline Dubai 7s in December despite these challenges."



UAE Pro League announce fixtures kick-off dates and times



The UAE Pro League has announced fixture dates and kick-off times for the 2020-21 Arabian Gulf League, Arabian Gulf Cup and Arabian Gulf League U21. The announcement follows a coordination meeting with the TV broadcast rights holders; Abu Dhabi Sports, Dubai Sports and Shariah Sports channels, held last week over teleconference.

The meeting discussed the proposed dates and kick-off times for fixtures in light of the new season draw conducted on 18th July and was chaired by Hassan Taleb Al Marri, UAEPL board member and head of technical committee and attended by Waleed Al Hosani, UAEPL CEO in addition to staff from the relevant departments and broadcasters representatives.

The 2020-21 season gets underway with the first leg of the Arabian Gulf Cup play-offs taking place on September 3rd and 4th, while the return leg is scheduled for October 1st and 2nd.

The opening round of matches starts with three fixtures on day one; Ittihad Kalba host Al Jazira at 19:00 and Shabab Al Ahli welcome Al Dhafra at the same time. September 3rd fixtures conclude with Fujairah playing Ajman at 21:30.

The Arabian Gulf Cup action continues on September 4th with two 19:00 kick-offs; Hatta vs Bani Yas and Al Ain vs Khorfakkan, while the round concludes at 21:00 with Al Wahda hosting Al Wasl. Based on the newly introduced cup format, league champions Sharjah and cup title holders Al Nasr received a bye to the quarterfinals.

Meanwhile, the Arabian Gulf League kicks-off on September 9th, with matchday one played over three days. On the 9th, Ittihad Kalba get the competition underway at home against Shabab Al Ahli at 18:45, while Hatta travel to Abu Dhabi to face Al Wahda at 21:30 on the same evening.

Matchday One continues on Thursday, September 10th with Fujairah hosting Sharjah at 18:45 and Al Ain playing Khorfakkan at 21:30.

The action concludes on the 11th with three games; Ajman host Al Dhafra at 18:45 and Al Wasl welcome Bani Yas at the same time while the Matchday One fixtures conclude with Al Nasr facing Al Jazira at 21:30.

first half of Arabian Gulf League is scheduled for completion with Matchday 13 taking place on January 1st and 2nd, 2021.




Two Emiratis claim Guinness World Records titles in July

Areej Al Hammadi claimed the title for Most football 'hotstepper' ball control tricks in one minute

Walid Yari raised the bar on Most side jump push-ups in 1 minute

Guinness World Records (GWR), the global authority on record breaking achievements, can today announce that the player of the UAE National Football Team, Areej Al Hammadi breaks the Guinness World Records title for Most football 'hotstepper' ball control tricks in one minute completing 86 repetitions in total, breaking the previous record stood at 56 in the UK. Moreover, Walid Yari is another Emirati who smashed the record title of Most side jump pushups in 1 minute competing 33 flying pushups in a single minute, a big jump on the previous record stood at 26 in India.

The two Emiratis achievements were announced at the launch of Guinness World Records Day 2020 (GWR Day) – themed Discover Your World – which is encouraging people to take on a new challenge now lockdown measures are easing, or simply turn a new found skill or talent into a world-record attempt.





Known as 'The Beast of the Middle East', Walid is a 34-year old fitness professional and social media content creator. He is taking the region by storm with a growing fan base of more than 650k+followers on Instagram. From the different types of workouts, he posts on social media, describe him as 'The Beast' because, according to him, there was no one else in the Middle East doing his style of freestyle and aggressive workouts.

Areej has paved her way to the top of women football in the MENA region. She is a Creative Services professional by day, and a footballer by night. She lived most of her life chasing opportunities in football, forming football teams both in school and during higher studies in the American University in Dubai, and attending many of the women's football championships within the MENA region. She finally made it to the UAE National Football Team.

The announcement of these two records marks the launch of this year's Guinness World Records Day; the annual celebration of record breaking that takes place in November each year. This year GWR Day will celebrate the Discover Your World theme of the latest Guinness World Records book. Whether people want to push themselves to the limit or have simply discovered a new passion or talent during lockdown, people are encouraged to see if they can turn it into a record.

Liverpool FC finally win the Premier League after 30 years!



Liverpool's 30-year English title drought ended this season as they were confirmed as Premier League champions. They also currently hold the World Club Championship title and the Super Cup.

Liverpool were last champions of England when they won the old First Division title in 1989-90 after which Manchester United and Arsenal, then Chelsea and Manchester City seize power.

There have been a lot of agonisingly close moments. In 2014, they missed out by the skin of the teeth after a defeat against Chelsea (Gerrard slip, Demba Ba goal). In 2019, they lost to Manchester City by a solitary point as the title race dragged on to the very last day of the season.

German manager Jurgen Klopp, now an iconic figure at the club, reached Anfield in 2015 after the sacking of Brendan Rodgers. Since his arrival, Liverpool have been consistent title contenders, three-time European finalists, and winners of the 2019 Champions League.

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic forcing a threemonth suspension of the season and delaying Liverpool's coronation, they have won the title with a record seven games to spare. They eclipsed the record jointly held by Manchester United (2000-01) and Manchester City (2017-18), who sealed their respective titles with five games left.

Had it not been for the unprecedented stoppage Liverpool were on course to smash the record for the earliest league title. Instead they are now the first team to lift the coveted trophy as late as June.

Liverpool ended last season with nine consecutive league wins and, after claiming the Champions League, began the new campaign in relentless fashion to leave all of their rivals trailing in their wake.

With 28 wins and just one defeat in 31 games, Liverpool had set a record-breaking pace and were 25 points clear in February – the biggest lead in Premier League history. When they beat West Ham United that month it was their 18th successive top-flight win, matching Manchester City's record, before their hopes of an unbeaten season were dashed by a 3-0 defeat at Watford, a result that was merely a blip.

And as Jürgen Norbert Klopp says "We will not stop."





CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the UAE official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

<u>Credit cards:</u> Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)

Fujairah to Al Ain

228 kilometres via Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Rd, through Maleha village, Madam roundabout and E55, approx 1 hour 58 minutes

Fujairah to Dibba and Musandam 68 kilometres via Khorfakkan/Al Aqah coast road, E99, approx 1 hour 13 minutes

Fujairah to Dubai (Burj Khalifa/Dubai Mall) 124 kilometres via Sheikh Khalifa Bin Zayed Rd, Maleha Road aka Sharjah /Kalba Road, turn direction westwards E611, approx 1 hour 19 minutes

Fujairah to Hatta

65 Kilometres through Kalba, through Kalba Tunnel and onto E102, approx 1 hour 11 minutes

Fujairah to Oman border (Kalba)




