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Commemoration Day: Remembering the UAE's noble sons



In 2015, His Highness Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, President of the United Arab Emirates, decreed that 30th November each year would be a national holiday originally called "Martyr's Day" but now known as "Commemoration Day" (and celebrated 1st December). It would be a day to honour and recognise those who sacrificed their souls in the line of duty.

Martyr's Day is a national day in which the United Arab Emirates expresses its appreciation for the sacrifices of the martyrs who sacrificed their lives defending the honour of the homeland.

Dedicating a day to the Martyrs is a response to the gratefulness, and a chance to express the real correlation between the nation and its leadership.

November 30th of each year, a day to honour

the loyalty of these martyrs of the nation, those who gave their lives for the sake of maintaining the dignity of the United Arab Emirates, while they were performing their functions and duties within the country and abroad in the civil, military and humanitarian fields.

On this national occasion, several dignified commemoration ceremonies and events take place, with government institutions, nationals and residents of the UAE, participating, recalling and showing their pride, dedication, values, devotion and loyalty within the hearts of the UAE people, which martyrs proved when they sacrificed their lives.

At 8am, the UAE flag will be lowered across the country (at all government and government-subsidiary premises) and will remain lowered until 11am. It will be followed by a one minute's silence and supplication from 11.30am to 11.31am.

After the one minute's silence, the UAE flag will be raised again while the UAE national anthem is played.



Wahat Al Karama

Wahat Al Karama which is also known by its English translation Oasis of Dignity, is a war memorial and monument in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates located across Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque to commemorate all Emiratis who are killed in the line of duty. The memorial was unveiled on the United Arab Emirates Commemoration Day on 30th November 2016. The memorial is composed of three structures: the leaning pillars, the pavilion of honour, and the memorial plaza. The names of all Emirati soldiers who are killed in duty are inscribed in the pavilion of honour.

The memorial is the first war memorial in the UAE and documents the names of all the fallen Emiratis who were killed in the line of duty. The first name is of a 20-year-old policeman, Salem Suhail bin Khamis, who declined to lower the Ras Al Khaimah flag in the Greater Tunb and was killed in the Seizure of Abu Musa and the Greater and Lesser Tunbs. The date of his death is marked as the UAE's commemoration day.

The site also sometimes serves as a meeting place for the Cabinet of the United Arab Emirates.

The memorial is a 46,000-square-metres site opposite the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque.

The Leaning Pillars consist of 31 massive aluminium tablets supporting each other, aside a glittering pool built specifically to reflect the Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque – a first glimpse of the Wahat Al Karama memorial is an awesome sight.

The pillars are inscribed with the national pledge of the UAE and Arabic poems by UAE founding father Sheikh Zayed bin Sultan Al Nahyan, president Sheikh Khalifa bin Zayed Al Nahyan, prime minister Mohammed bin Rashid Al Maktoum, and Mohammed bin Zayed Al Nahyan.

Surrounded by a terraced amphitheatre, the 4000-square-metres Memorial Plaza is a wide circular space. Made from travertine stone shipped from Turkey, the whole space can easily accommodate up to 1200 people.

Sheikh Zayed Grand Mosque in Fujairah opens to visitors



The Sheikh Zayed Grand mosques in both Abu Dhabi and Fujairah will be reopened to visitors starting Sunday 3rd October the Ministry of Presidential Affairs have announced. In addition to the two mosques, the Founder's Memorial will also be reopened but under strict precautionary measures in line with the highest standards of health and safety.

The reopening decision was taken in coordination the National Emergency Crisis and Disaster Management Authority (NCEMA) after months of being closed as a precautionary measure to limit the spread of COVID-19. A set of measures have been put in place ahead of the reopening including limiting the capacity of visitors allowed inside all cultural landmarks. This is to ensure that the number of visitors is under control during the permitted timings to avoid overcrowding and guarantee social distancing and smooth flow of movement during their tour of the cultural attractions.

Thermal cameras will also be installed at all entrances of these landmarks to detect body temperature where a special room has been also dedicated to isolating visitors, who show high body temperature. Additionally, the visitors' track has been carefully identified to ensure social distancing, avoid gatherings and guarantee a healthy tour within a safe environment. Meanwhile, public cultural tours and borrowing services of electronic devices, clothing and other services will remain suspended.

The precautionary measures that have been put in place will be displayed in videos on internal screens and social media platforms particularly Instagram to explain and simplify them to all segments of visitors. Instruction panels were also installed to educate visitors on the need to adhere to wearing masks throughout their visit and to a safe social distancing of at least two meters while touring the landmarks.

NCEMA said that all cultural monuments are subject to intensive sterilization work, starting from their entrances to vital places where users pass through, periodically and are using the latest devices and materials approved for sterilization in coordination with competent authorities.

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Fujairah celebrates the birth of the Prophet



Under the patronage of His Highness Sheikh Mohammed bin Hamad bin Mohammed Al Sharqi, Crown Prince of Fujairah, the Emirate of Fujairah organizes a television operetta entitled "The Hymns of Light," which is presented in a special lyrical and poetic style on the occasion of the anniversary of the Prophet's birthday, which will be shown on this occasion on a number of Arab television screens.

The operetta – which will be shown on a number of Arab television screens – will be attended by 12 artists from the Emirate of Fujairah, through sections that include poetry, painting, Arabic calligraphy, music and Emirati *Maldist* art.

The operetta includes, in its first paragraph, the reading of the poem "In Praise of the Messenger of God" from the words of the poet Salima Al Mazroui and the performance of the media Fawzia Ahmed. The poem is accompanied by two paintings in Arabic calligraphy: "Waleed Al-Huda.

The second paragraph includes the operetta song "The Hymns of Light" written by the poet Dr. Muhammad Abdullah Saeed Al Hamoudi and composed by the artist Ali Obaid Al Hafiti, with the participation of artists Hamid Al Abdouli, Hazaa Al Dhanhani, Ali Bin Rabiah, the Fujairah Academy of Fine Arts choir and the distribution of music by Osama Ismail.

The operetta was also devoted to displaying a poem "We see Badra" written by the poet Khaled Al-Dhanhani and recited by the journalist Ahmed Al-Yamahi. The poem is accompanied by scenes of painting the Prophet's Mosque by the artist Amna Jassem. The words of the operetta narrator were written by artist Faisal Jawadib, while the narrator is played by the theatre artist Abdullah Masoud.

The operetta concludes with the Emirati mald art, which reminds the audience of the Emirati folklore and the tolerant Islamic values and muwashahat praises the Holy Prophet Muhammad, may God bless him and grant him peace, for the performance of the Dubai Folk Troupe in cooperation with the Fujairah Folklore Troupe.

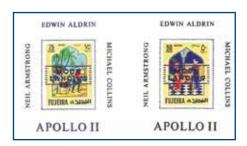

Each stamp was produced in miniature sheet format – but never issued! Then they were released overprinted Moon Landing/ Apollo 11 either in Gold or Metallic Blue. Only 500 sets were issued. This concept of producing the set in minisheets was used quite extensively by other 'Trucial States' – but not often by Fujeira.

23 Nov: all stamps (except the gold stamp) and minisheet were overprinted with the Olympic winner's name. This time the 25Dh Cycling stamp overprinted with Pier Franco Vianelli (Italy) was





produced in Gold – both perf and imperf with the imperf also produced in Prestige minisheet on stiff paper not as thick as in the previous issue!

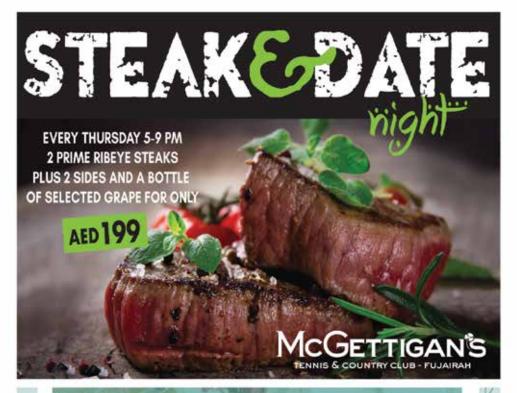

It was getting towards the end of the original contract signed by the Government of Fujeira with Mr. Finbar Kenny on 15 June 1964. Clause 15 of this contract stated 'this agreement shall be in force for a period of 5 years automatically renewable for an additional 5 years...'. The Government was very unhappy with the performance of Mr Kenny especially since he was never available and payments were not prompt. But the Minister of Telecommunications went ahead and signed again for another 5 years. But the Sheikh of Fujeira was considering alternatives and only issues already approved were issued in May and June. These and the events that followed will be discussed in the next chapter.

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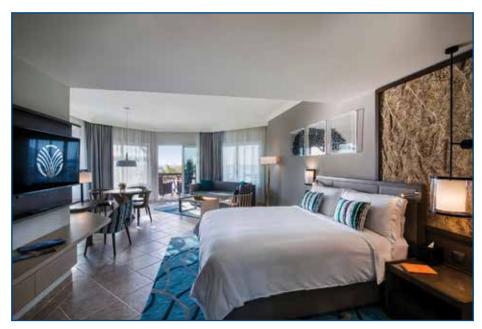

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Coronavirus: Hefty fine for private tutoring in homes, UAE lawyers warn



The UAE Public Prosecution authority has warned that in-person private teaching lessons are a violation of the precautionary measures aimed at countering the COVID-19 pandemic.

It's posted a message on social media stressing that face to face tutoring sessions breach the government's protocols.

This applies to public and private places, as well as home visits, with or without fees, and to all educational grades.

People involved in the lessons will be fined AED 30,000 for being present or organising classes. While those responsible for the venues face a penalty of AED 20,000.

The Public Prosecution stated it had issued the warning to reinforce the community's awareness of the rules, as well as to ensure individual adherence.

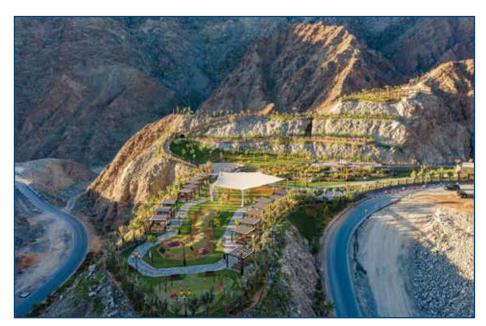

Sharjah Ruler inaugurates development projects in Khorfakkan



H.H. Dr. Sheikh Sultan bin Muhammad Al Qasimi, Supreme Council Member and Ruler of Sharjah, inaugurated several tourist and urban facilities and inspected various planned projects in Khorfakkan last month.

Beginning his visit from Shees, Dr. Sheikh Sultan was briefed on the plans of the Shees Rest House project located on Khorfakkan Road, which will be implemented in three phases in the northern and southern parts. The rest will include 60 shops selling honey, fruits, and vegetables. The Rest House also contains nurseries and carpet outlets as well as food trucks. The project will also have more than 217 car parking lots.

Thereafter, he inaugurated Shees Park, where he unveiled the commemorative plaque to mark the official opening and then toured the park's different facilities and watched a documentary film about the work done on the park, which was completed in eight months.

The 11,362-square metre park has a 25-metrehigh artificial waterfall and also includes several paths which are 506 metres in length. There is a playing area, 32 shaded seats, and an outdoor theatre that accommodates 70 persons, as well as a barbecue area.

Dr. Sheikh Sultan stopped in Najd Al Maqsar village, which comprises 13 old houses dating back to nearly a century, which the people then used as a haven from the flow of torrents.

After being re-equipped with the latest facilities to receive visitors, the village will include 13 hotels in heritage style, mosque, toilets, barbecue areas and outdoor sitting areas. In addition, the upper fortress of the village established nearly 300 years ago on the summit of the mountain, which was part of the defence network of Khorfakkan, will be restored.

The Ruler of Sharjah was briefed about Najd Al Maqsar Oasis and the Rest House project. He ordered the implementation of self-harvesting farms and all facilities for visitors and tourists. He also inspected several development projects.

BESIX, Jan De Nul win Dibba Fujairah port expansion project deal

The design-and-build contract consists of dredging the navigation channel and port basin, reclamation and shore protection, as well as constructing breakwaters, a 765 m long quay wall, foundations for ship loader rails, port infrastructure and creating utilities and aids to navigation. The fishing harbour will be relocated in the process.

The expansion plans are part of PoF's strategy to increase the port's bulk handling capacity and operational efficiency, as well as improve the quality of its service, which is considered among the best in the world.

The consortium's approach to optimise the design by providing 'value engineering', along with the newly-established Central Marine Support department, presented a strong, competitive solution to the client.

The contract is valued at 371 million AED (90.4 million EUR). Works will be carried out over 19 months.

- Close your eyes, sit in a calm clean place, in a comfortable position.
- Take a few big deep breaths.
- Breathe in, As you do that, imagine that the air is filled with a sense of peace and calm. Try to feel it throughout your body.
- Breathe out, While you're doing it, imagine that the air leaves with your stress and tension.
- As you breathe in, say within, "I breathe in peace and calm".
- As you breathe out, say, "I breathe out stress and tension".
- 7. Continue to do the same for 7 to 10 minutes.

Deep breathing is one of the best ways to lower stress in the body. This is because when you breathe deeply, it sends a message to your brain to calm down and relax. The brain then sends this message to your body.

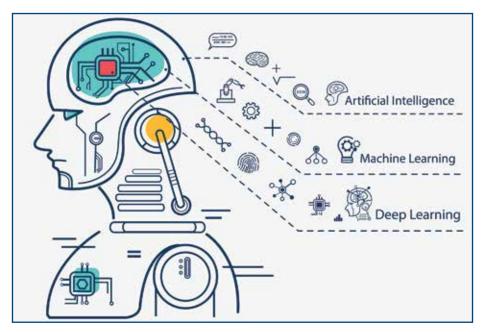

The global economy is constantly shifting under our feet and while it may be a bit of a shaky ride at first, it can be quite a journey for those who adapt and learn how to ride the waves.

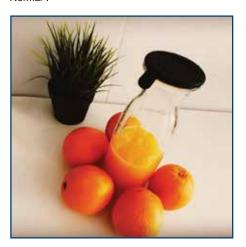

The Geological Trail - Ain Al Sheria



The weather in Fujairah is much cooler now and there are no excuses for not spending a few adventurous hours in the north of the Emirate trekking. The Geological Trail starts in Ain Al Sheria, there is limited car parking and access to the route is really only suitable for 4x4's. Simply type 'Ain Al Sheria' into Google Maps and it will find you.

The Geological Trail is named for obvious reasons. The drive to the start gives glimpses of things to come but when you are up close to these mountains you realise just how high they are. As the trek begins you are instantly surrounded by large rock formations and an infinite variety of colours, there are folds that the formed over

millions of years, faults running many metres and rich veins of quartz.

I was accompanied on this trek by Sikander Khan Durrani, Abdel Rehman El Sheikh and Stephen Suhas Abhang, 3 very knowledgeable geologists from the Fujairah Natural Resources Corporation. I can say with absolute certainly what they don't know about geology can be written on the back of a postage stamp.

Fujairah Observer will be featuring an in-depth report into the Geology of the region in a future publication.

This is quite a long trek at 8.8km and very demanding. The first kilometre is a fairly tough physical effort gaining height along the Wadi, then the serious climbing starts on the purposebuilt hiking trail. There is little chance of getting lost on the trail and signposts are located where



they are needed. On the trail up the Wadi are a series of stone towers marking the way. Once on the manmade sections the trail is quite obvious, as I said there are a few signs but this is long trek and well away from the roads. Stephen actually asked me who made the trail and how long did it take? The credit for this trail goes to Fujairah Adventures and Saeed Al Memari. Marko Gauna and his 7-man construction team took several months building the entire trail. I have constructed many trails in Fujairah's Adventure Park and I can tell you with absolute certainty there has been blood, sweat and tears shed in the construction of this trail for you.

Once you leave the Wadi you are exposed to the elements, I have walked this trail twice and both times I was ill prepared. The first time I thought

a bottle of water was enough to get me round, I wish I had taken dried fruit and extras to snack on, to keep my energy levels high. The second time I went around, I had spent about 100 aeds in Lulus and I'm sure the donkeys you might see on route would have complained about hauling the amount of supplies I had. Energy and hydration levels were fine on my second time, but I was exposed to the sun and got quite badly burned.

At the highest point, climbing out of the valley you are about 500m above sea level and views are simply breathtaking. From the top (if you know where to look) you can see across to the giant petroglyph that is Khar Ghail, which will be the next stop. To get there the trail contours the edge of the mountain for about 2km or so. At times there are areas that have steep cliffs dropping away immediately next to the trail. This isn't really for the fainthearted. Be brave and you will be rewarded with the chance to go back 3000 years in time and try to decipher the glyphics carved into the large 3m tall rock.

We spent some time at Khar Ghail and when it was time to start the descent, I really wished I had kept moving. My legs were stiff and the descent is immediate and you quickly lose height. Complacency kicks in and you find yourself (sometimes) ignoring the amazing scenery all around you. After the big descent you will then take the single-track trail that winds its way with a bit more up and down back to your starting point of Ain Al Sheria. The route takes about 2.5 hours to complete.

Advice to all, as well as the normal standard trekking equipment, take sun protection, hats, long sleeve shirts and enough food and water for











a full half day of trekking. Even though the days are cooler, this is still an exposed trail. I would recommend leaving early with the safety net of time afterwards should you need it. I have heard stories of hikers leaving too late in the afternoon and struggling on the later parts due to lack of light. There are areas with no cell phone coverage and a whistle is a must. This really isn't a place to taking any sort of risks. Ain Al Sheria has areas for

BBQ, a fresh (cold) font of drinkable natural water and shaded areas where you are welcome to relax before or after your trek.

Staying safe online - Online safety guidelines for kids



The dramatic shift to online learning as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic has also opened a Pandora's box for our young children who spend more than ten hours in the virtual world. A recent news report from London was really startling and pointing towards the vulnerability of our children in the cyber world.

A father who initially paid £4.99 (Dhs 23.82) for his 11-year-old daughter to use a game app was shocked to discover a bill for £4,642 (Dhs. 22,163.14), a month later. In a similar incident, a teenage boy from Punjab, India spent a whopping 1.6 million on popular battle royale game PUBG making in-app purchases. The 17-year-old spent money from his parents' account to buy in-game cosmetic items, artillery, passes for tournaments, and virtual ammunition. The above mentioned incidents show that our kids need to be made aware of the dangers of the internet and taught how to protect themselves from various online threats. This is the digital age where information is at everybody's fingertips. Even young children these days have access to the internet via smartphones and tablets. Kids go online to play games, watch movies or cartoons, interact with their peers on social media, and to do research for homework assignments or school projects.

Threats to children's internet safety include invasions of privacy, cyberbullying, sexting and harassment. Parents, teachers and school authorities can make sure their children are safe while browsing online using the following tips

12 Tips for the internet safety of children

- # In order to guide and advice children about online safety, parents and teachers must be equipped with the working knowledge of smart phones, social media platforms, internet applications and various internet dangers. Many parents shy away from learning the operation of new gadgets and internet applications. Children misuse the ignorance of their parents. Keep an open mind and enthusiasm to learn new things.
- # You may be starting to think your child knows more about using technology than you do, and you may be right. Make it your business to keep up to date and discuss what you know with your child. Remember children lacks maturity and wisdom.
- # Remind the children that once they have written something they can't delete it. What you post in internet will have a permanent foot print. Therefore advice and monitor your child's internet interaction. Discourage the postings of private photos and feeling or mood updates such as feeling sad, bored, and scared. Internet fraudsters may misuse the photos and strangers may try to

connect you seeing the mood or feeling you have updated.

- # "Make sure your children only message and accept friend and contact requests from people they know. Strictly forbid your children's interaction with strangers and never agree to a private chat with a stranger.
- # On computers and any other devices your child has access to, set the parental controls to the appropriate age, and enabling access to only appropriate content. Buy or download parental control software, switch it on and keep it updated. Internet Service Providers (ISPs) also give their customers free parental controls which can be activated at any time. Check them out and take advantage of them.
- # Warn your children about the dangers of posting private information online. Don't give out personal information such as mobile phone number or home address online for all to see.
- # Children have a tendency to download games, films, videos and other applications and often such downloads seriously affect child safety. Sexual predators and other criminals often target kids through this download. Children may expose to sexual contents and personal information may be stolen.
- # Monitor your child whether he or she use internet late-night. Many teenagers spend sleepless night chatting with strangers or class mate Romeos. Sexual predators are active on internet late night hours targeting children.
- # Communication is key to develop understanding between parents and children. Let the child know that you are interested and involved and that you will help when needed. Listen carefully and politely. Don't interrupt the child when he is trying to tell his story.
- # Tell your child not use the social media platforms to hurt others, bullying, threatening and breaching privacy.

- # Explain to your child that being online doesn't give them anonymity or protection, and that they shouldn't do anything online that they wouldn't do face-to-face.
- # Children are unaware of the legal restrictions and copy right issues. For example I have found some children tried to access banned web sites and applications by installing Virtual Private Network (VPN). Parents should aware that children may access via VPN the websites and applications, which you try to prevent by installing Parental, control software.
- # Monitor your child whether they access to inappropriate content online such as pornography, racist, violent, extremist or other harmful material.
- # Buy or download only apps, games, online TV and films which have age ratings, which you should check before allowing your child to play with or watch them.

In short, Today's children are born into a technology-based society and expert the usage of Internet at an early age. As parents and teachers, it's our responsibility to talk to them about the hidden dangers of the Internet, teach them safe Internet habits, and implement practical strategies like the above steps to help them do so safely.

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Coordinated Bilateral Movement

The ability to use the right and left sides of the body together at the same time or with alternating movements is called bilateral coordination. If you pay attention to babies who have just started to crawl, you will find out how they use their arms and legs in a coordinated manner to move forward. As the left arm moves, the right leg moves. And as the right arm moves, the left leg moves. This is the beginning of whole-body bilateral coordination.

This bilateral coordination movement activates a special part of the brain called the Corpus Callosum. The Corpus Callosum is a bundle of over 200 million nerve fibres located directly between the left and right hemispheres of the brain, and it is responsible for helping the left and right sides of the brain communicate with each other, acting like a messenger bridge.



If both hands or legs do the same movement at the same time with an equal amount of force it is called symmetrical coordination. For example, clapping hands, jumping jacks, throwing a ball with two hands, catching a ball with two hands, and bouncing a ball with two hands, etc.

Movements where actions are carried out first by one hand or foot, and then the other, in a rhythmic way is called asymmetrical coordination. For example, riding a bicycle, walking, and running, etc. Activities like cutting with scissors, writing on a piece of paper, tying shoelaces etc., where you need to stabilize an item with one hand, while your dominant hand does the more skilled work to perform the task is called dominant and non-dominant coordination.

Children who have marked impairment in motor coordination that significantly impacts on their academic achievement and activities of daily life can seek the help of a physiotherapist. A physiotherapist may evaluate the abilities of the child and recommend ways to promote the growth of any skills that the child is struggling with. To develop more complex motor skill in a child, a physiotherapist will break down the challenging skill into smaller components and train the child until mastery is achieved. It helps to build a sense of achievement in the child by being able to learn a new ability. Physiotherapy sessions may focus on improving low muscle tone, immature balance reactions, awkward running or walking patterns, poor posture, the ability to throw/catch a ball, the awareness of body position in space and sense of direction.

Osteoporosis - think about them bones, early

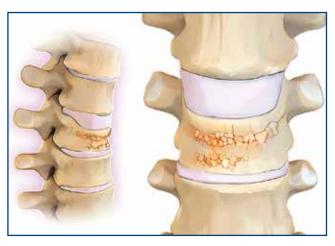
Osteoporosis World (WOD), Day held October 20th each vear, marks а vear-long campaign dedicated raising global the awareness prevention, diagnosis and treatment of osteoporosis. WOD aims to make osteoporosis and fracture prevention a global health priority by reaching out to

health-care professionals, the media, policy makers, patients, and the public at large.

Osteoporosis itself is silent with no expressions or indications that it exists. The number one problem is the increased risk of bone fractures. Osteoporotic fractures occur in situations where healthy people would not normally break a bone; they are thus labelled as fragility fractures. Fragility fractures appear in the spine bones called vertebrae, rib, hips, and the wrist.

A Compression Fracture is not a fracture where the bones are cracked into two pieces. The vertebrae may collapse from above and or below. Typically, patient complain about sudden onset back pain. Some people develop radicular pain. With time, progressive collapse and involvement of more spine bone fractures, people tend to stoop forward, experience a loss of height and develop pain.

Ask your Doctor about a DEXA Scan: For women over 65 and men over 70, DEXA scans are only appropriate for those with moderate risk of fracture or when the results will change the patients care plan. Younger women and men



ages 50 to 69 should consider the test if they have risk factors for serious bone loss. This test tells your bone mineral density. Osteopenia is a condition that begins as you lose bone mass and your bones get weaker. This happens when the inside of your bones become brittle from a loss of calcium. It is very common as you age. Total bone mass peaks around age 35. People who have osteopenia are at a higher risk of having osteoporosis. Osteoporosis is a bone disease that occurs when the body loses too much bone, makes too little bone, or both. As a result, bones become weak and may break from a fall or, in serious cases, from sneezing or minor bumps.

Become aware early: prevention of osteoporosis should ideally begin in childhood, aiming to achieve high peak bone mass and overall a healthy lifestyle throughout life. Awareness of osteoporosis and its problem could lead to taking the steps necessary to prevent stooping, fractures and pain.

In order to prevent bone loss during the middle ages and avoid late stage fractures, one must also consider safety. Great bones are made by paying attention to calcium and vitamin D intake, the pounding of weight-bearing exercise, and strength training.

Falls are the biggest risk factor and can be

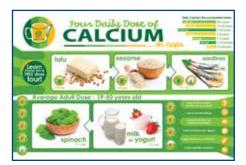
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prevented with house modifications and exercises aimed at balance and agility. Therapeutic intervention in the late ages is recommended, such as grab rails and no loose carpets. International and national strategies are present throughout social media which are aimed at common mistakes and identification of those risks.

Ask your doctor to check your vitamin d levels. Worldwide, more than 50% of the population is vitamin D deficient. The American Academy of Orthopaedic Surgeons and recent research support that the body needs at least 1000 international units per day for good health – depending on age, weight and growth. In general, babies (especially mothers who are breastfeeding) and small children should intake at least 400 IU of Vitamin D daily. Children over age 5, adolescents, and adults should get a minimum of 1000 IU of Vitamin D each day. Check with your medical doctor to assess your levels by blood test.

If you shun the sun, have milk allergies, or follow a strict vegetarian or vegan diet, you might be at risk for vitamin D deficiency. Low blood levels of vitamin D has been associated with increased risk of death from cardiovascular disease, severe asthma in children, cognitive impairment, and cancer. Research suggests that vitamin D could play a role in the prevention and treatment of type1 (juvenile) and type2 (adult onset) diabetes, hypertension, glucose intolerance and multiple sclerosis.

Calcium is critical in the making of bones. The chart below shows recommended dosages, and sources.





Simply put good posture is the proper alignment of the spine. Optimal alignment leads to the most efficient position to carry the spine. Misalignment of the spine leads to increase forces seen by the spine. Over time misalignment can lead to tons of pounds of forces placed upon the spine per year.

Proper posture and alignment of the spine compounds positively over the years.

Walking is a weight bearing exercise Walking in all forms is beneficial. Walking builds strong bones, promotes mental clarity, involves use of the heart and lungs, and promotes facet joint mobility and nerve root mobility and function.

Uphill walking is different in that the spine joints are in a flexed open position, which might be helpful in conditions where there is nerve root tightness. Uphill walking may even help patients with spinal stenosis and other ailments because it opens up the spinal channel. Downhill walking is different since the spine joints are in an extended closed position, which could worsen conditions where there is already nerve root tightness. The spinal channel tends to close as well.

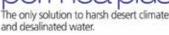

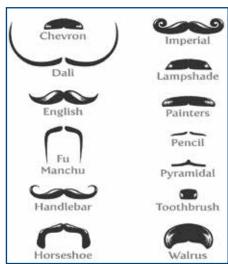

Animal charities in southern Spain were urgently seeking homes for 110 cats after they and their owner were evicted from a flat in Valencia.

The cats had been left homeless after they and their owner were evicted from an apartment in the town measuring 100 square meters, they said. Apparently the owner took in a pair of cats three years ago and they have been procreating ever since



Spooky Spiderweb Found In Forest. It Looks Big Enough To "Catch" Humans

Deep inside a forest in the US state of Missouri, a conservationist stumbled upon a huge spider web that some people say looks big enough to "catch"

humans. An employee of the Missouri Department of Conservation came across the spider web while out on a trail in Springfield recently and snapped a photo, which the department shared on Facebook last week.

The photo has freaked out plenty of people, especially given that the spooky web was discovered just in time for Halloween.

The web was spun by an orb weaver spider also known as spotted orb weavers or barn spiders. These large and hairy spiders are harmless to humans and known for their intricate webs. Many orb weavers are nocturnal and " have the peculiar habit of eating and rebuilding their webs each day. They help keep insect population in control and their bites are not dangerous for humans.



29 Tonnes Of Carrots Dumped On A London Street

Twenty-nine tonnes of carrots were dumped on a street in London, leaving onlookers mystified. Londoners took to social media to share photos and videos of the 29,000 kilograms of carrots that were dumped outside Goldsmiths College in south London. A lorry was recorded offloading the produce onto a street on the university campus as a crowd of students watched.

The mystery was revealed when Goldsmiths responded to one of the viral tweets and explained that the carrots were part of an art installation by a student.

"It is an installation called 'Grounding' by the artist and MFA student Rafael Perez Evans," the college wrote on the microblogging platform, adding that the installation is part of Goldsmiths' MFA degree show. A statement from the artist Rafael

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Perez Evans further revealed that "produce in the piece are unwanted carrots, carrots that the food industry in the UK deems not worthy of shelves." The carrots will be removed after the exhibition and donated to farm animals.

While Mr Evans had arranged for the carrots to be collected and sent to feed animals, News reports that many students were filmed climbing on the artwork and taking carrots home to eat.

The artwork garnered mixed responses on social media, with some criticising it for contributing to - rather than highlighting - the problem of food wastage.



Bull's 8.6-foot horn spread earns Guinness World Record

An Texas longhorn bull name Cowboy Tuff Chex is now a Guinness World Record holder thanks to his 8.6-foot span of horns.

Cowboy Tuff Chex, originally bred by Bob Loomis in Overbrook, Okla., before being purchased in 2017 by Richard and Jeanne Filip of Fayetteville, had his horns officially measured at the Texas Longhorn Breeders Association's annual Horn Showcase and was declared a Guinness World Record holder.

The bovine was issued a certificate for the longest horn spread on a living bull.

The Filips said Cowboy Tuff Chex's horn spread was already so wide when they purchased him that they had to buy a special trailer just to make sure he would fit. They said the bull's popularity had led to a spike in requests for tours of their ranch.



Camel walks 100 km alone back home to find old owner

Temur, the camel's former master and his wife had sold the camel to another farmer back in October 2019. The man took it to his home raised it in their hometown in winter and grazed it in the mountains in spring. The animal seemed to have adjusted to its new home, but on June 27th, it ran away.

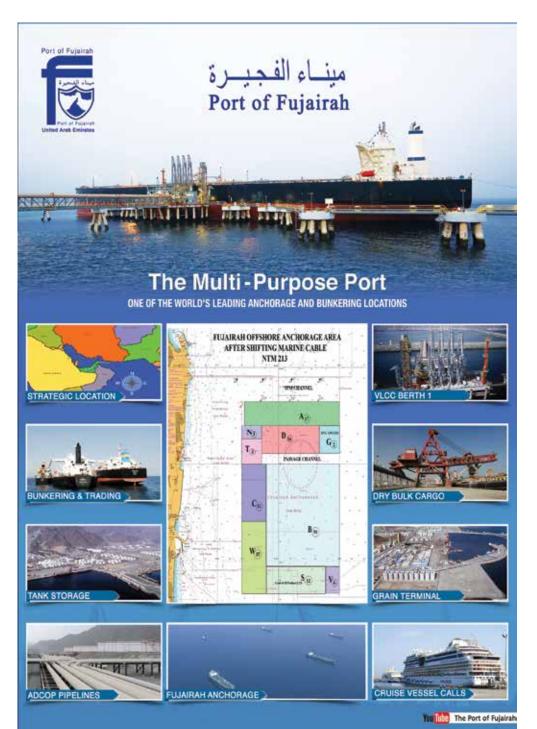
The loyal camel allegedly spent days crossing the barren desert of North China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region to reach its former home. The injured animal was spotted walking through the desert by another herdsman who took it in and tended to its needs while trying to find its owner. News of the camel's discovery reached its owner who rushed to retrieve it, but after hearing about the animal's arduous journey, its former masters wanted it back.

The homesick camel had walked more than 100 kilometres through the desert, wading through mountains, crossing highways and fences before finally approaching its old home, which was when the herdsman spotted it.

When its former owners heard about its risky journey, they decided to take it back.

Temur's wife said. "So we contacted the buyer and decided to replace the old camel with a 3-year-old female. After we got it back, I was so distressed when I found that it had lot of wounds on its body, as it must have got crossing the fences."

"We will not sell it to anyone else anymore, as camels are intelligent animals," the woman added. "It will be free for the rest of its life".







Norwegian police seize electric scooter capable of doubling the legal speed

Oslo police seized a privately-owned electric scooter capable of travelling up to 58 kilometres per hour, nearly three times the legal limit for a scooter. Cops took the scooter as part of a control program in the Norwegian capital's downtown area, as part of a joint operation with the Norwegian Public Roads Administration.

Oslo police said electric scooters cannot exceed the 20 kilometres per hour (12.4 mph) speed limit. Fatal accidents have been reported with rental e-scooters, which are common in Europe and have, in other cases, landed people in emergency rooms. The scooter was seized and destroyed, officials said.



Pompeii artefacts returned by tourist who claimed 'curse'

A contrite Canadian woman who took pieces from the ancient Italian city of Pompeii 15 years ago returned the fragments with a letter explaining how they brought a "curse" to her life.

The woman, who signed the letter with the name Nicole, said she visited the Archaeological Park of Pompeii when she was "young and dumb" about 15 years ago and she took items from the site on Mount Vesuvius which erupted in the year 79. Nicole's letter contained two mosaic tiles, parts of an amphora and a piece of ceramics - said she had experienced a string of bad luck since the theft that included two bouts with breast cancer. The package was sent to a travel agent in Pompeii with a request that the items be returned to the park. A spokeswoman for the archaeological park said there have been about a hundred previous incidents of tourists sending Pompeii artefacts back to the city along with apologetic notes claiming the objects were cursed. The park has established a museum to display the returned items and the letters from apologetic tourists.



5,000 Kg Bomb Explodes Underwater In Poland, Hundreds Evacuated

A massive World War II bomb exploded during a delicate operation to defuse the five-tonne device in a channel near the Baltic Sea but no one was harmed, Polish officials said. The device nicknamed "Tallboy" (earthquake bomb) was dropped by the Royal Air Force in an attack on a Nazi warship in 1945. It was discovered last year embedded at a depth of 12 metres (39 feet) with just its nose sticking out during dredging close to the port city of Swinoujscie in northwest Poland. More than six metres long, it was laden with 2.4 tonnes of explosives -- equivalent to around 3.6 tons of TNT.

The navy had ruled out a controlled explosion for fear of destroying a bridge 500 metres away. Instead, it had planned to use a technique known as deflagration to burn the explosive charge without causing a detonation, using a remotely controlled device to pierce through the shell to begin combustion.

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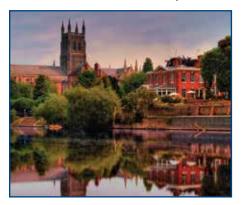

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Arabian Gulf Cup playoff roundup: first leg



The first leg of the Arabian Gulf Cup playoff round, which was held under "commit the slogan to succeed". كأس الخليج العربى concluded on ARABIAN GULF CUP Friday October

9th with three teams getting wins away from home, two earning home victories and one game ending in a draw.

Khorfakkan had a flying start to the season and are now favourites to advance to the next round after collecting a surprising 4-2 victory over Al Ain at Hazza bin Zayed Stadium. The game saw Wilson Eduardo miss the first penalty of the season. The Eagles will be looking to seal the qualification ticket when they host the Boss on November 13th.

Bani Yas also moved a step closer to the next round of the competition after earning a valuable 2-0 away win over Hatta. The away victory will ease the Sky Blues' mission in the return leg on November 12th at Bani Yas Stadium. Despite the defeat, Hatta completed the most passes in the first leg (593) with an accuracy rate of 88 per cent.

Al Wasl came from behind to edge Al Wahda 2-1 thanks to João Figueiredo's last-gasp goal. Despite the win, Al Wasl are expected to face a tough task when they host the Clarets at Zabeel Stadium on November 13th.

Meanwhile, two teams only were able to get home wins, as Ittihad Kalba earned a late 2-1 win over Al Jazira after a last-gasp goal from Peniel Mlapa, while Fujairah emerged 1-0 winner over Ajman thanks to Waleed Al Yamahi own goal.

The only draw was between Al Dhafra and Shabab Al Ahli, as Denílson netted a late goal for the away side. Al Dhafra keeper Khaled Al Senani put in an





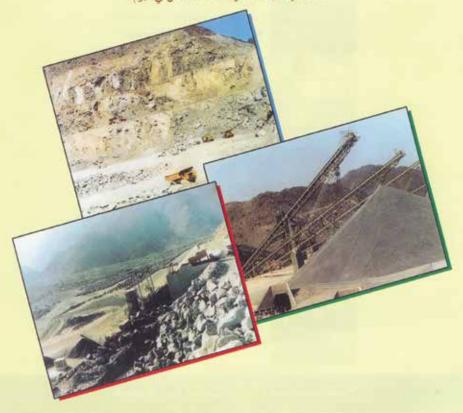
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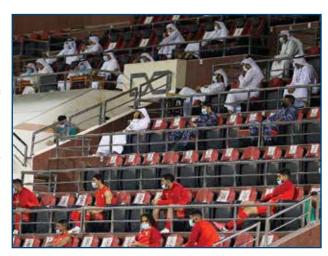
impressive performance as he saved six shots to become the keeper with the most saves in the competition, so far.

A total of 17 goals were scored in the first leg of the playoff round with an average of 2.83 goals per games. Togolese forward Peniel Mlapa top the goalscoring charts as he has two goals to his name after scoring a brace against Al lazira.

Khorfakkan have the best offensive record after netting four goals in the first leg. Meanwhile, Hatta and Ajman failed to find the back of the net

and Bani Yas and Fujairah were the only teams to keep a clean sheet in the first leg.

Only one red card was handed during the first leg matches as Al Ain's Mohsen Abdullah was



sent off in the 89th minute of his side's clash with Khorfakkan.

The second leg of the playoff round is scheduled to be held on November 12th and 13th.



Happy 80th birthday to 'The King'

Pele (Edson Arantes do Nascimento) celebrated his 80th birthday last month, 'The King' left an incomparable legacy in football, here are some tales, trivia and stats about the original soccer superstar!

The names

Dondinho and Celeste named their first son Edson after Thomas Edison, one of the greatest inventors in history. His family nicknamed him 'Dico', but he received the moniker 'Pele' in school due to his mispronunciation of Brazilian goalkeeper, Bile.

The promise

Dondinho and his friends, transfixed to a radio, were euphoric – Brazil had just gone 1-0 up in a decider against Uruguay they only needed to draw, at the Maracana in 1950, to win their first World Cup. A nine-year-old Pele therefore left home for a kickabout with friends.

"When I got back I was dumbfounded," Pele recalled. "It was the first time I saw my father cry. He was devastated. I promised him, 'One day I will win you the World Cup."

Pele, who had previously wanted to become a pilot, was now determined to become a footballer.

The explosion

Waldemar de Brito, the former Brazil striker, was coaching Bauru, now-defunct state minnows, when he discovered a boy wonder on their books. He took Pele for a trial at Santos, boldly proclaiming his protégé would become "the best player in the world".

Coach Lula heard this, chuckled, but upon seeing Pele during his first training session immediately handed him his first-team debut, which Pele scored on as a 15-year-old in 1956. Over the next 18 years the forward propelled Santos to 25 major titles, including two Copa Libertadores and Intercontinental Cup crowns apiece.

National treasure

With Inter Milan, Juventus, Manchester United and Real Madrid having all tried to sign Pele,



the Brazilian government, under president Janio Quadros, declared him an 'official national treasure' to prohibit him moving overseas.

127

Pele extraordinarily scored 127 goals for Santos FC in one calendar year: 1959.

The chance No10

Pele immortalised the No10 jersey across the globe – but only by chance. Brazil forgot to submit their squad numbers to FIFA for Sweden 1958, so they got chosen randomly. Goalkeeper Gilmar and centre-back Zozimo were allocated the No3 and No9 respectively – but Pele, who began as a reserve, somehow got the number he duly made the most famous in football.

25

Brazil goals Pele reached in merely 20 caps. No other player in history has reached the quartercentury for international goals while still a teenager.

The man who stopped a war

Between one and two million people died during Nigerian Civil War (1967 to 1970). Astonishingly, a 48-hour ceasefire was called between the Nigerian government and the secessionist state of Biafra in 1969 so they could watch Pele and Santos draw 2-2 with the Nigerian Super Eagles, with 'The King' receiving incessant applause and a standing ovation from the home fans.

You can't dethrone royalty!

Merely two-and-a-half months before Mexico 1970 kicked off, Joao Saldanha, who masterminded Brazil's perfect qualification campaign, unthinkably dropped Pele for a friendly against Chile. A few hours later he was sacked.

World Cup records

Pele is the youngest scorer, youngest hat-trick scorer, youngest Final player and youngest Final scorer in World Cup history.

Uwe Seeler, Pele, Miroslav Klose and Cristiano Ronaldo are the only men to score in four World Cups. The West German pipped the Brazilian to become the first to do so by less than three minutes in 1970.

Vava, Pele, Paul Breitner and Zinedine Zidane are the only players to have scored in two World Cup Finals.

Pele registered six assists at Mexico 1970 – a record for one World Cup. Four players managed five: Robert Gadocha at Germany 1974, Pierre Littbarski at Spain 1982, Diego Maradona at Mexico 1986 and Thomas Hassler at USA 1994. Pele also recorded an unprecedented three assist in deciders: one against Sweden in 1958 and two against Italy in '70.

The Baptist

'The Beautiful Game', a universally-used nickname for football, was coined by Pele. He also baptised Brazil's Mexico 1970 champions as 'The Beautiful Team', which also stuck.

The King of New York

Soccer barely existed in New York in the early 1970s. Celebrities did. A who's who of the world's biggest. But when the New York Cosmos sensationally brought Pele out of retirement in 1975, soccer's popularity exploded, the Cosmos became the most glamorous club on the planet and 'The King' became the VIP of VIPs in NYC.

Film: Escape to Victory

Pele had a lead role in the 1981, John Hustondirected hit film, which also starred Sylvester Stallone, Michael Caine, Max von Sydow and Bobby Moore, about Allied prisoners of war playing an exhibition football match against the Germans. Pele also appeared in several Brazilian soap operas, TV series and films, American movie hotshot and British mockumentary Mike Bassett: England Manager.

Pele netted six goals in merely two appearances against France, scoring a hat-trick in a 5-2 victory in the Sweden 1958 semi-finals and another treble a 3-2 win in a Paris friendly in 1963. The opponents he scored most times for Brazil against were Paraguay (ten goals in nine games), followed by Argentina (eight in nine).

Music

Four days before turning 80, Pele released *Acredita No Véio* (Listen To The Old Man), recorded with 2019 Grammy winners Rodrigo y Gabriela.

Pele has loved music all his life and composed hundreds of tracks since the early 1960s. He famously carried a voice recorder with him everywhere because "a song can some into your head at any time – even at a World Cup."

Celebrity and honours

In 1970, Pele was named the most famous person on the planet! A few years later, the brand 'Pele' was named the globe's second-biggest – behind Coca-Cola.

Pele, Muhammad Ali and Jackie Robinson were the only sports people to make the 1999 Time magazine compilation of The Most Important

People of the Century.
That same year, Pele was one of nine sports people bestowed by the International Olympic Committee with the 'Athlete of the Century' award, despite, having never partaken in the Olympic Games.

Pele was the inaugural recipient of the Laureus Lifetime Achievement Award in 2000.



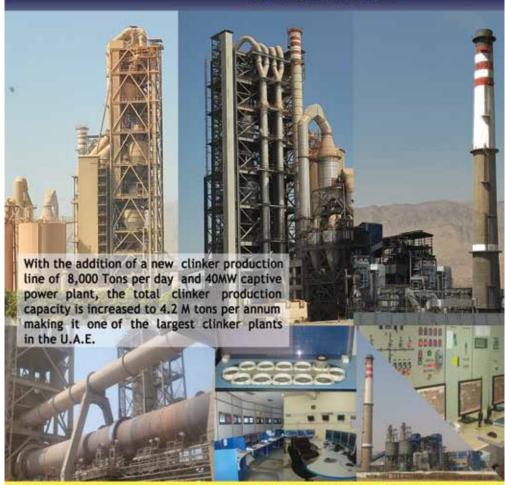


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Nurmagomedov retires after UFC 254 win over Justin Gaethje

The final night of Fight Island 2 appropriately delivered a historic, end-of-an-era moment as Khabib Nurmagomedov called time on a faultless career after defeating Justin Gaethje in their UFC 254 Lightweight bout in Abu Dhabi.

The last of a five-event series delivered on the expectations with the popular Russian defeating his American opponent via a triangle choke at 1:34 of round 2 at Abu Dhabi's Yas Forum. Immediately afterwards, having broken down in tears, he announced his retirement to the watching world before thanking his team and fans. He also paid tribute to his father who had passed away on July 3rd due to coronavirus complications.

"Thank you for these guys, these guys with me, been with my father for more than 10 years. All my team, AKA with coach Javier, I love him so much, all my team," he said. "Today, I want to say, this was my last fight. No way am I going to come here without my father. It was the first time, after what happened with my father, when UFC called me about Justin. I talked with my mother for three days, she didn't want that I go fight without my father. I promised her, it's going to be my last fight, and if I give my word, I have to follow this. It was my last fight here."

Khabib defeated Justin Gaethje and then announced his retirement.

Nurmagomedov, 32, then demanded that he be acknowledged as the No. 1 pound-for-pound fighter in the world, before name-checking all those who had helped along the way in his UFC career.

"[I'm the] UFC undisputed, undefeated lightweight champion, 13-0, 13 in UFC, 29 in all pro MMA career," he added. "I think I deserve it. One more thing, I want to say thank you Lorenzo Fertitta, thank you Dana, Hunter, all guys. Thank you so much, and of course I don't forget about Joe Silva who signed me here in UFC. Joe Silva, thank you. All this UFC team, everybody around the world.



this whole pandemic stuff, they are doing a great show. Thank you so much Justin. Justin, 2016 I remember when I cut weight, you helped me a lot. Thank you, brother. I know you are a great man, I know how you take care of your people. I know a lot of things about you, because of your parents, because one day, it's going to happen. You never know what is going to happen tomorrow, you never know."

Khabib Abdulmanapovich Nurmagomedov was a professional Russian mixed martial artist. He notably competed in the lightweight division of the Ultimate Fighting Championship (UFC), where he was the UFC Lightweight Champion from April 2018 until his retirement in October 2020. With 29 wins and no losses, Fight Matrix ranks him as the #2 lightweight of all time (behind B.J. Penn). He was the first Muslim to win a UFC title. A two-time Combat Sambo World Champion, he is trained in sambo, judo, and wrestling. His style of grappling has made him one of the most dominant athletes in the history of MMA. As of October 2020, Nurmagomedov is the most followed Russian celebrity on Instagram, with more than 23 million followers.

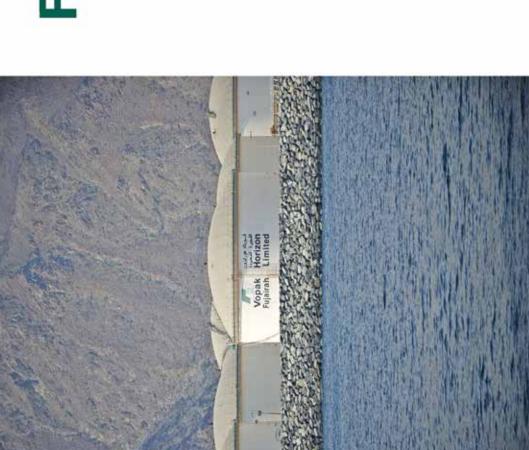

CLIMATE: The sun shines year round but Oct. to March, the days are pleasant (26°C, nights 15°C) Summer is April to Sept. and temperatures peak around 50°C with high humidity. The sun can be fierce so heatstroke, heat exhaustion are always a risk. Sunglasses, hats, and high factor sun creams are essential, especially for children.

DRESS: As in many Arab/Muslim countries dress should be modest. Wearing revealing tops or shorts in public places is not advisable.

CURRENCY: The dirham (pronounced dir-ham) is the UAE official currency. Dirham notes are in 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500, and 1000 denominations. The dirham is divided into 100 fils. Coins are 1 dirham, 50, 25, 10 and 5 fils.

<u>Credit cards:</u> Major credit cards are widely accepted by car rental companies, the bigger stores, hotels and some restaurants, however you should carry some cash for general shopping and eating out at smaller establishments.

Exchange: There are no currency regulations and foreign currency of almost any denomination is readily exchanged in the UAE The dirham is index linked to the US dollar. 1\$ = Dhs 3.68. The exchange centres are found throughout the UAE such as the UAE Exchange Centre, opening hours are from 8:30am right through to 9:30pm, 365 days a year. Banks: Most Banks open at 8:00 am and close at 1:00 except Mashreq Bank who open until 4:15pm. They are closed all day Friday and public holidays.

SHOPPING/TIPPING: Bargaining is expected, especially in souqs, where prices can drop dramatically. Tipping is common for most services but it is not obligatory.

PUBLIC HOLIDAYS

Religious holidays are tied to the Islamic calendar and therefore dates vary. Friday is the Muslim holy day. Islamic Public Holidays are often not announced until a day or two before they occur:

(During the Holy Month restaurants and shops close during the day, and office hours during Ramadan are often reduced by two hours daily. The end of Ramadan is marked by Eid Al Fitr.)

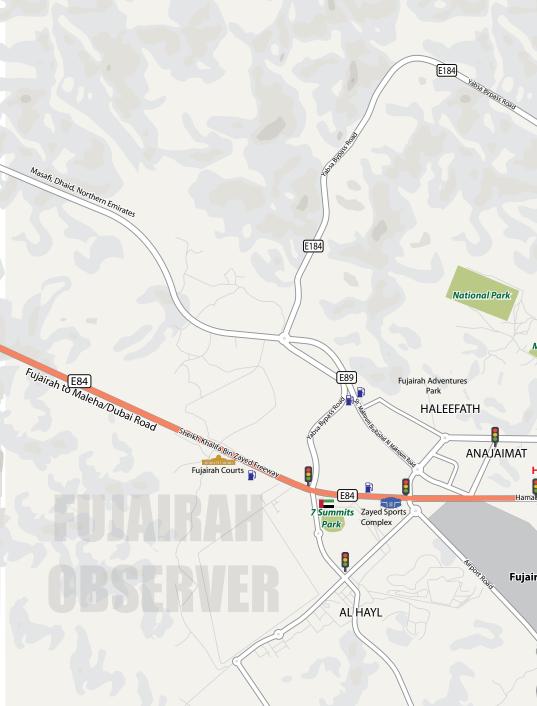

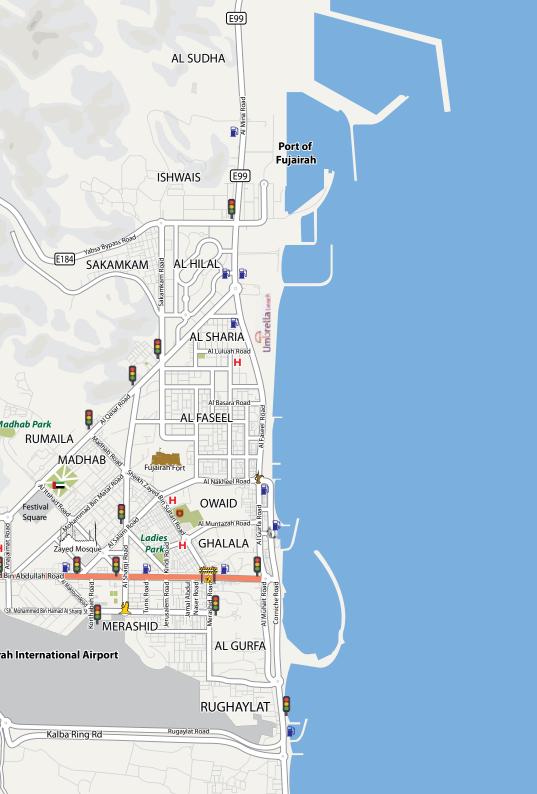
